Beloved Saints of New Spirit,

We have made it through the heaviness and solemnness of the 40 days of Lent. We have celebrated the resurrection of our Lord Jesus. We have welcomed back the Alleluia. Our worship services will once again feel more joy filled and hopeful, at least for a while. Eventually we will lose that feeling of joy that comes with Easter Sunday. We can feel overwhelmed during these conversations. Often, we simply avoid talking about them so that we don't have to deal with the emotions. We would rather ignore and look the other way instead of talking, let alone taking action.

Where is our hope? How do we live a life based in the hope we are given? Do we believe or have hope that things can actually be better?

"Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all of the darkness." - *Desmond Tutu*

I do have hope that things can be better for all of us. I have hope that the love we are shown through Jesus can and will change this world for the better for all people. It is out of hope for a better world

that I go through the process of learning and changing. It is hope that drives me to confront my own shortcomings. It is love and hope that leads me to preach about change. In 1st Corinthians 13:13 Paul reminds us that Faith, Hope, and Love abide. Remember abiding means to be present, or dwell. The writer of the gospel of John uses abide to mean that things are so interconnected that it is impossible to see where one ends, and another begins. Hope is alive! Love is alive! Jesus lives! And because of that, things really can change even when things seem overwhelming.

I HAVE THIS HOPE by Cathy Cermak

As we end our first quarter of Pastor's book study and discussions on poverty and racism, I can't help feeling overwhelmed and discouraged. The centuries' old systems set in place by the "powers and principalities" of this world, by "Empire," and designed to keep the poor, disenfranchised, and oppressed powerless and the rich and entitled in power have existed since before Jesus' time on earth. So what are we to do? How can we possibly fight against the hatred, greed, evil and troubles that have always been a part of life? Didn't Buddha say, "life is suffering," so why bother? And even Jesus said, "In this world you will have trouble." John 16:33.

Ahh, but Jesus said more than those seven words! The whole verse reads: "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." So even in the midst of my despair and sadness, I have this hope because of Jesus. Because Jesus took the hatred, horrors, pain and suffering of this world to the cross; because Jesus overcame the world and rose from the dead; because Jesus wants me to care, *because Jesus lives*! I must believe this profoundly if I am to move forward. **We, New Spirit, must believe this profoundly if we are to make a difference!**

At the end of each book study discussion, Pastor asks, "What can New Spirit do?" A few ideas we've thrown around include:

We must educate ourselves and dialogue even more about poverty and racism. (For starters, join Pastor's book study and discussion and/or participate in the upcoming Mitigating Racism & Building Community Zoom Workshop sponsored by phoenixpeacebuilders.org and the AZ Poor Peoples' Campaign.)

Learn more about poverty assistance and housing programs, eligibility and rules (food, healthcare, childcare and housing), so we can better assist and advocate for our neighbors in need. Learn more about housing rights.

Learn more about voters' rights in AZ to facilitate our neighbors to use their voices.

Write to our local and national legislators about our concerns and the issues we support. It's important that they hear from us and know that not all Christians support the right-wing Christian Nationalist agenda. A good start is to sign up for LAMA's newsletter (at lamaz.org.) to stay informed about urgent issues.

Provide information and advocacy services to the poor (for food, poverty programs, housing and/or voting assistance).

Participate in the AZ Poor Peoples' Campaign and help expand it in Tucson.

Confront racist, anti-poor and anti-LGBTQIA+ statements and biases

when we encounter them (even in ourselves). Make a stand.

So, there is reason for my hope. We are not alone. Jesus is with us in these struggles and this work because it is His work also. There's an old Tenth Avenue North song called, "I Have This Hope". I encourage you to listen to it on YouTube. The chorus goes,

"I have this hope

In the depth of my soul

In the flood or the fire

You're with me and You won't let go."

Jesus won't let go of us, New Spirit.



STEWARDSHIP UPDATE: Reasons to Celebrate at New Spirit

Just a couple of months ago we were planning for our ministry activities for 2024, and because of your generosity, intended giving increased by 20% over 2023. And now that we are actively engaged in our planned ministry growth it's time to share how the first part of 2024 is progressing.
