Dear Partners on the Journey,

The season of Advent is peculiar. All around us the festive lights and decorations spell out the joyful anticipation of Christmas. All around us the spirit of the season is one of generosity, kindness, welcome, care, and concern. As the seasonal song proclaims, "It's the most wonderful time of the year." I guess.

With a certain peculiarity, we walk into a darkened Sanctuary. The darkness is symbolic for the state of the world, and the lives of too many people. That's not exaggeration, it is the truth. For many people these are difficult times. But, each week, each week after a full seven days of bumping into obstacles, a light appears. It is a small light. One candle-power. It gives enough light to give us hope against the darkness. Each week we will add light to the darkness. It is a process. It is a journey. It is our approach to the birth of the Christ Child. That great news begins in the darkness. The first words of our Wednesday Advent worship will be "Jesus Christ is the light of the world." One small light stands against the darkness.

I know the disconnect between the focus of Advent readings and the festive call of our culture. I cringe, some years, when families choose to come to worship during Advent to "get some of the Christmas Spirit" only to walk away scratching their heads. There is "an expectation" that worship in these weeks before Christmas will be more......cultural. If the malls can play "I'll be Home for Christmas", why can't we sing "Silent Night?" We will.....in time.

Advent is that time between the rings of a bell. If you have even heard a large bell peel, you know that the clapper must travel from the first strike to the other side for the second strike. That short distance of silence is Advent. We will soon hear the second strike, the Good News of Christ's birth.....but not yet. It is Advent, and it is peculiar.

I want to encourage you to step into Advent with both feet. Join us for worship each Sunday. Join us for supper each Wednesday, and Holden Evening Prayer following supper. Show your support of our confirmands as they "Affirm their Baptism" on Sunday, December 23rd, at one service at 10:00 a.m. Invite your friends, neighbors, family, and more to worship Christmas Eve.

Our traditional service will be at 4:00 p.m. This time gives families time for supper, and enables those who don't drive after dark to attend. It will be a service of Carols and Candlelight, simple in format and very familiar in carols and the Christmas message.

Our neo-traditional service will be at 8:00 p.m. This service includes traditional carols, new Christmas music, Holy Communion, Candlelight, and the Christmas message. We, the Praise Team, have resurrected a song written for us by Merri Dee Snider, back when we were just getting going.

Remember, the theme of Advent is simple: Light enters the darkness, and the darkness gives way to Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. Let that be so!

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held, Sunday, December 9, 2018 at 4:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary. All confirmed members "in good standing" are expected to attend.



To be "in good standing" requires you to have received communion and given a gift of record (financial contribution recorded as tithe/offering) in the past year. The gift

of record was given as a check, or using your assigned offering envelope. Unidentified cash offerings are not credited to members.

Sign-in for the meeting is legally required so we ask that you arrive early for the 4:00 p.m. meeting to sign-in. The agenda includes:

Election of one at-large Church Council member,

Election of one member to the Endowment Board,

Appointment of two members to the Memorial Garden/Columbarium

Board.

Appointment of three members to the Nominating Committee.

Appointment of three members to the Audit Committee.

Presentation of the 2019 Church Budget: discussion, and vote.



The meeting will be followed by a "Chili & Cornbread Supper" by the Youth Group in preparation to attend the ELCA National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis in June 2021. The supper is a "Fundraiser event" to help offset the \$1,000/person cost to attend the Gathering.

Worship the Sunday after Christmas will be at 10:00 a.m. It will be a simple, traditional Carol and Communion service.


We will return to our two-service schedule on Sunday, January 6th.

There will be a meeting of parents and youth with Pastor Alan between Services on Sunday, Dec. 9th in Room 105.

Our goal is to Celebrate their Affirmation of Baptism in May 2020 which is only 18 months away.

The class will be held on Wednesdays January 9, 23, 30, and February 6 at 4:00 p.m. and at 6:15 p.m. The class is open to everyone.

WELCA-DEBORAH'S GATHERING BIBLE STUDY met November 14th.

Gloria Burke, Barbara Rebok, Linda Lamb and her daughter Stephanie attended the Grand Canyon Synod convention in Phoenix. One of the main speakers was Pastor Meghan Aelabouni who wrote the current Bible Study in the Gather magazine we use for our study.



Our study is on A Time for Faithful Repentance-what does it mean and why is repentance important in the life of Christian faith? Our focus verse comes from 1 John 1:8-9. We pray it every Sunday!

We discussed what happens when the church repents because of racism, anti-Judaism and other attitudes and practices that lead away from God, some from Luther's time.

The Gather magazine is used for our study which is just one section. There are many other articles besides the study which are life stories. We place our extra monthly magazines on the WELCOME table in the Narthex and invite women to take them home and read the articles!!

Many cards were sent out by Sandra Colwell for birthdays, church visitors, illnesses, and other changes people have had to make. We put together handmade Christmas cards that are sent to people who can no longer come to church. Joyce Dow brings materials she has cut for us to use.
