Dear Partners in the Gospel,

We sing a song at the 9:00 service, whose lyrics has become an "ear-worm" for me: "I've been here before, and here I am again....standing at your door, hoping you'll let me back in...." ("Undo" by Rush of Fools). There are a lot of familiar signs in the world again this year.

It is Advent. We now begin, again, our annual preparation to consider the promised return of the Messiah into a world that seems all torn apart. The power of political intrigue has shadowed nearly everything we do. That image, the shadowed, strife-filled, tug-o-war for righteous power flavors the season for us. The fact of that "contrasting flavor" sweet and salty is exactly the taste of Advent writers in the Bible. For many of us, the commercial encouragement of "It's Beginning to Look a Lot Like Christmas" is just an emotional tease to draw our sights from the reality of Advent and its preparation to the "Most Wonderful Time of the Year." These will be interesting days.

Our Mid-week Advent Services will focus on this year's theme: "The Gift of Presence." Each Wednesday we will consider a number of ways through which you and your family will be able to better prepare and be present in your Advent and Christmas preparations. There will be three Wednesday services: December 4, 11, 18. Christmas is on Wednesday this year. We will put up the tree and decorate the Sanctuary on December 4<sup>th</sup>. Services will be at 6:30 p.m.

It is my hope that each of you will commit to step into the Spiritual preparations for the coming of the Lord's Messiah. Prayer will be emphasized. Words of care, compassion, and even confession will be encouraged. Gentleness in self-care, and other-care, will be recommended.

We are preparing to step into a brief, but historically rich season. It is not so unlike those days prior to Jesus' birth. For the people of that land it seemed that the struggle was cosmic, or

universal. It was into that very world God's plan was carried out. One light will stand against a very true darkness. But, and there's always a but, God would come unexpected, unadorned, and quiet as the wiggles and wonder of a baby-child.

May your Advent be spent with us each Sunday and each Wednesday to help prepare a way within each of you to receive the Christ, the wonderful Counselor, mighty Lord, everlasting, the Prince of Peace.

Congregational Annual Meeting will be held at 4:00 p.m., Sunday, December 8<sup>th</sup>. The agenda will include a vote on the approval of the 2020 Mission Plan (budget), election of Church Council members, and a Vice President (Vice President assumes President's seat after 1<sup>st</sup> year. The third year they serve as ex officio President of the Council.) Endowment Board will appoint/elect 2 members. Memorial Garden/Columbarium Board will elect one member to a three-year term. Audit team will be appointed for one-year term.

Members-in-Good-Standing are eligible to participate. A member "in good-standing" must have a record of one communion and a recorded gift of record (tithe). Cash gifts must be given using assigned number giving envelops. Undesignated cash offerings cannot be considered as gift-of-record. A sign-in sheet will be used to check you into the Annual Meeting. If your name does not appear on the list, according to our records you have not received communion nor given a gift of record.

Following the Congregational Meeting the Youth will serve a Chili & Cornbread dinner as a fundraiser as they prepare for the 2021 ELCA National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis.

**BOUNDLESS** is the theme of the <u>2021 ELCA National Youth Gathering</u> in Minneapolis. **BOUNDLESS** could reflect the energy of 40,000 teenagers gathered for five days of Jesus, the Holy Spirit, choirs of angels, and a vast crowd of witnesses. **BOUNDLESS** could reflect the excitement of nightly gatherings in the Minnesota Vikings' new Stadium where music, faith-stories, challenges and prayer come together. **BOUNDLESS** could reflect the work that 12,000 youth adorned in bright orange t-shirts will do in and around Minneapolis doing projects, building, painting, rehabbing, sharing stories, learning of issues faced by the poor, outcast, homeless, and more.

**BOUNDLESS** does reflect the nature of God's love for our fractured and broken world. **BOUNDLESS** does reflect the power of joy that fills one's life when the Holy Spirit shows up. **BOUNDLESS** does reflect what can be done when 40,000 come together for five days of Christ-centered, worship-filled, and learning-focused experience.

New Spirit, we ask you to begin to pray today for the youth of New Spirit who will be planning to attend the Minneapolis Gathering. Today, our group could be 12 youth (one dozen) and the adult(s) who will accompany them in June, 2021. Pray, everyday, for the BOUNDLESS joy that awaits in Minneapolis.



"Conversations about the Refugee Crisis" lends itself so well to the present dilemma for Refugees in the world. The Lutheran Church has been a key-hub for the resettling of refugees for over 100 years. In the present form of dialogue sides have been taken, and there is little room for conversation or debate. "Conversations about the Refugee Crisis" is a five-session video discussion about the history, the law, and the process for refugees to be received legally into the U.S. This curriculum was put together by Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS) one of only five agencies which resettle refugees in the U.S. It has been distributed through "Sparkhouse" a subsidiary of Augsburg-Fortress press.

#### **Lutheran Disaster Response Consultation 2019**

I have been a proponent, supporter and enthusiast for the ministry of the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response teams. We have often asked for donations when floods, fires, or tornadoes have struck in this country. LDR uses 100% of our donated funds for direct aid to those in need. There is no other aid-service that can match that. And beyond that, LDR commits long-term to get communities back on their feet. Again, no other agency can claim that.

This year's consultation dealt with Climate Change and the Mitigating the damage assessments which will increase due to global warming. It was a fascinating conference.

I will give one illustration, and three steps for New Spirit. On our first morning, Chief Albert, of the Houma-Choctaw tribe shared that his tribal land, Isle de Jean Charles, has been reduced in size by 80% due to rising tides. This bayou island is at its highest 10 feet above sea level. In the past decade tides have risen 3-4 feet. The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and FEMA know of the Houma's dilemma, but claim there is "nothing they can do." Indeed. The first victims of climate change in America will be/have been Native Americans. Chief Albert's story can be viewed on YouTube: "Can't Stop the Waters."

Climate Change affects everyone. Each congregation creates a carbon-footprint by its practices and uses. LDR issued a call to congregations to work to lessen its wasteful use of electricity, water, natural gas, paper, plastic and foam products all of which add to carbon-footprints.

I issued the following three points for New Spirit to address in the near future to do our part lessen climate change.

Create a "Green Team" to complete an inventory of light sources, and costs to replace them with LED bulbs and fixtures, to closely monitor HVAC usage with programmable thermostats that cannot be accessed by just anybody. Install electric charging stations in the parking lot for electric cars.

Set a date to end "single use paper, plastic, and foam items (paper plates, plastic utensils, foam cups)".

Consider how and where to plant trees on our campus. (We had talked about planting trees on the edges of the parking lot. Is it time to consider an orchard in the front three acres? We will be contacting the U of A School of Landscape architecture to give us some ideas.)

Installing "solar panels" topped the list of what could be done. We did not act fast enough 5 years ago when solar was made available to non-profits. We do know an array of solar panels will cost over \$100,000. That array would be installed on the patio area to create a shaded area for congregation activities.

At the Annual Meeting we would like to begin this 3-step process by identifying a Green Team (3 persons). The Church Council at its November meeting voted to cease purchasing foam cups, paper plates, and plastic utensils.



It's tough on the streets. For some, it's tough to keep a roof over their head. Their stories are heartbreaking. Mental health, alcohol, and drug issues are just part of the problem. These are also people who have just had a perfect storm of health, employment, and financial issues and now find themselves homeless or close to it.

Our event the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month has representatives from City of Tucson, and Office of the Independent Police Examiner to provide help for those who face adversity every day just to live. Sometimes, they come and have just had their possessions stolen. During extremely cold weather, we are able to provide emergency blankets, tarps, gloves, and hats. New Spirit's Homeless Blessings Team provides a hot meal, tarps, blankets, hats, gloves, coats and warm socks, 1-day bus passes, packaged food, protein drinks, hygiene products, first aid products, and clothing.
