ANNUAL MEETING SET FOR JANUARY 9

The Annual Congregational Meeting of New Spirit Lutheran Church will be Sunday, January 9, at about 11:15am, after worship. As of now, we expect to meet in person this year, in the sanctuary. Masks will be required. While the agenda isn't fully set, we will vote on a budget for 2022 and for Church Council members and other positions.

We will hold a budget preview meeting the prior Sunday, January 2, where we'll talk through the proposed budget and try to answer any questions that arise.

Please be sure to be there for the Annual Meeting. All are welcome to attend. Voting members are strongly encouraged to come. Let your voice be heard!

TRANSITION PROCESS—SEEKING NEW PASTOR

Our official transition coach, Deacon Janice Zimbelman, visited New Spirit on November 14 to share an encouraging message during worship and to talk through the pastoral transition process at a congregational forum afterward.

Highlights of her presentation:

Prior to the pastoral search itself, the congregation will engage in a careful and thorough self-study to get an honest read on where we are and to arrive at a solid consensus on where we see ourselves going (our vision for the future). This part of the process is led by a Transition Team that is appointed by the Church Council.

The findings from the self-study go into a written Ministry Site Profile (MSP), the document that describes our congregation to the Bishop and other synod staff, to help them identify potential candidates who would be a good fit for us. The MSP also goes to the potential candidates themselves, to help them determine whether they want to interview with us.

As the MSP is being completed, a Call Committee is appointed to conduct the next part of the process: interviewing candidates and—with the guidance of the Holy Spirit—identifying someone to recommend to the congregation.



Prayer is essential. Deacon Janice noted that's the key role of the Holy Spirit as we seek to follow God's guidance. The whole transition process, she said, should be "bathed in prayer."

You'll be hearing a lot more in coming months. Your voice and your participation are essential. Please feel free to bring any questions, thoughts, or concerns to a member of Church Council or one of the pastors. This process involves *everyone!*

Usually, a friendly conversation occurs as the packet is given to the visitors at their home, and an invitation is again extended to attend worship at New Spirit. There are new faces now at New Spirit because of these connections!

Offering hospitality to visitors is a highly important part of our ministry at New Spirit. Thanks to all of you who participate in many wonderful ways to make our church a great place not only to visit but also to consider becoming a member of our community.



CHRISTMAS IS COMING!

IS YOUR LIFE DRIVEN BY PURPOSE?

The beginning of a new year is always a good time to examine or re-examine our lives. Am I living in alignment with God's purposes for me? Should I be adjusting my trajectory or reconsidering my focus?

We're going to look at our lives and God's purposes for us during "40 Days of Purpose," starting January 16. Copies of the book will be available at church ahead of time and are free to everyone. (If you'd like to contribute, you can give \$5 per book.)

This is also going to be an outreach effort, something to invite our neighbors to join in on. We'll be mailing postcards to households in our area, inviting people to come for worship to hear the messages or just to participate in reading and discussion with a small group. We want this to be a blessing for as many people as possible. Please consider handing copies of the book to your own friends and neighbors and inviting them to join in.

May God bless us all as we look to recommit ourselves to his purposes.



NEW YEAR, NEW GROWTH?

NEW SPIRIT TO HOST TAX ASSISTANCE SITE

New Spirit will return to hosting an AARP Tax Preparation Assistance Site this year after using a one-on-one approach last year. The site will be open from 1:00pm to 5:00pm on Tuesdays and from 9:00am to 1:00pm on Saturdays, beginning February 1 and ending on April 9.

Because of COVID, we will limit the number of people in the Fellowship Hall at any given time, so appointments will be required. In addition, we will ask for proof of vaccination and require everyone to wear a mask while in the building.





SUNDAY SCHOOL CHRISTMAS PROJECT

Each year the Sunday School department sponsors a project at Christmas to give back and share the blessings of Christ with others. This year we are helping two different groups. One group is San Juan Baptista Lutheran Church on Bilby Road. Due to COVID-19 they have not opened, but they are working actively with a children's shelter in Nogales, Arizona. They serve children up to age 12. We are collecting coloring books, crayons, picture books, socks, shoes (used are fine), toothbrushes, toothpaste, and simple food items (dried black beans and pinto beans, white rice, flour, and sugar). These simple foods go a long way to provide basic nourishment.

Additionally, we are collecting books for Angel Heart Pajama Project. These books are given to foster and immigrant children. Books are distributed several times a year to children and give them a sense of belonging. Any books for children in grades K-6 are welcome whether new or gently used.

We will provide a flyer in upcoming bulletins for anyone who wishes to donate. We will be collecting through the end of the year. Money or checks (payable to New Spirit) can also be dropped in the offering with the notation: Sunday School Christmas project.

We appreciate all the support we have had over the years for our annual Christmas Projects. So many people have benefited, and our Sunday School kids get to learn the joy of giving. We are looking forward to another wonderful and fulfilling project.

Hopefully, you have been able to access the LAMAz newsletter that is online for all to read. The website URL is LAMAz.org. Listed below are some of the activities and events that you may be interested to read about and to participate in as you wish.

On Nov. 18 @ 2:30 - 3:30 PM, a webinar on our Afghan neighbors was presented with policy updates about the resettlement of Afghan arrivals. The needs of these arrivals and actions for assistance will be discussed by leaders from the ELCA and other Lutheran communities.

On Nov. 22 @ 6:30-7:30 PM, a book study on *Caste* by Isabel Wilkerson, which delves into a study of racial justice.

Other areas of interest include actions by the current administration on the needs of children, the reduction of racial disparities, and climate issues.

In the LAMAz newsletter for Nov. 16, we are encouraged to support a White House conference on food, nutrition, hunger, and health. This is a bipartisan, bicameral conference that supports programs such as SNAP, the School Breakfast Program, and the National School Lunch Program.
