What To Do About Poverty

On February 16, 2025, we will be hosting a special guest as the fulfillment of one of the 2024 stewardship initiatives. This will be the capstone to this year's study of poverty. Our guest will be Shane Claiborne. Below is Shane's bio from Shaneclaiborne.com.

"Shane Claiborne is a prominent speaker, activist, and best-selling author. Shane worked with Mother Teresa in Calcutta, and founded The Simple Way in Philadelphia. He heads up Red Letter Christians, a movement of folks who are committed to living "as if Jesus meant the things he said." Shane is a champion for grace which has led him to jail advocating for the homeless, and to places like Iraq and Afghanistan to stand against war. Now grace fuels his passion to end the death penalty and help stop gun violence.



Shane's books include *Jesus for President, Red Letter Revolution, Common Prayer, Follow Me to Freedom, Jesus, Bombs and Ice Cream, Becoming the Answer to Our Prayers, Executing Grace*, his classic *The Irresistible Revolution, Beating Guns,* and his newest book, *Rethinking Life*. He has been featured in a number of films including "Another World Is Possible" and "Ordinary Radicals." His books have been translated into more than a dozen languages. His work has appeared in Esquire, SPIN, Christianity Today, TIME, and The Wall Street Journal, and he has been on everything from Fox News and Al Jazeera to CNN and NPR. He's given academic lectures at Harvard, Princeton, Liberty, Duke, and Notre Dame. In 2023, Shane

received the prestigious The King Center's Beloved Community Award for Social Justice from Dr. Bernice King (daughter of Martin Luther King Jr. and Coretta Scott King).

Shane speaks regularly at denominational gatherings, festivals, and conferences around the globe."

News from the Grand Canyon Synod -- LAMA's 2025 Policy Priorities

The Lutheran Advocacy Ministry Arizona (LAMA) Policy Council convened for its annual retreat, a lively and prayerful gathering, on November 17–18. In just 24 hours, council members discerned a vision for 2025, guided by faith, social teachings, and the pressing needs of Arizona's communities. Rooted in the ELCA's commitment to be a publicly engaged church, LAMA has outlined six key areas for the year ahead:

Food Insecurity: Tackling hunger and its root causes by continuing initiatives like the Hunger Leaders Network and partnering with organizations such as Arizona Faith Network and Bread for the World.

Civic Engagement: Encouraging faithful, nonpartisan voter participation while addressing the intersections of justice, voting, and elections.

Support for Public Schools: Advocating for public education as a cornerstone of community welfare, from academic excellence to essential services like school meal programs.



Informed Christian Engagement: Promoting education and dialogue on what it means to live and serve as faithful citizens in a complex society.

Immigration: Partnering with Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest to advocate for compassionate immigration reform and the dignity of all individuals.

Housing and Homelessness: Joining efforts with Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest to address affordable housing shortages and homelessness in Arizona.

CHRISTMAS IS COMING!

Then, on Sunday, Dec. 29, come for a service of Christmas PJs, Ugly Christmas Sweater, Lessons and Carols at our usual worship time, 10:00 am.





The Shelter has the name in English of "The House of Mercy of the Nations." In Spanish, "La Casa de Misericordia y de Todas las Naciones", often called "La Casa" as a nickname.

On November 9th, New Spirit Lutheran Church delivered a coffee grinder and 60 pounds of coffee beans, along with cereal, rice, and pinto beans to San Juan Bautista Lutheran Church, to be sent to the shelter in Nogales, Sonora, Mexico. Pastor Mateo travels to the shelter once a month to give Mass in the cafeteria.

Sister Lika, Angelica Macias, first opened the shelter with a group of women to give sandwiches to children of the factory workers. She is also an artist, and her artwork is in the form of murals on the walls at La Casa.

A lawyer from Tucson works with the residents of La Casa, around 120 of them, to help them form their 'declaration of credible fear' to request asylum, which is submitted electronically to the United States border authorities. The main building has a health office, a workspace, and a play space for infants. There is also a school with teachers that serve the primary and secondary level students. The residents also receive medical care both physical and psychological.

PASTORS' BOOK STUDY

It is hard to believe that we have reached the end of the 2024 Pastor's Book Study reading list. We spent this year reading works focused on poverty and related issues. Jennifer Brown created the Ally Continuum, the four "stages" of being an ally are Apathetic, Aware, Active, and Advocate. The first three stages rely heavily on education. As a church that serves those that are homeless and food insecure, we must continue to learn about the struggles of those that we serve as well as about the systems at play. This year's readings were challenging, insightful, and hopefully inspiring for all those that took the time to read them.

You may have noticed in the title of this article the apostrophe moved. In 2025 the format of the book studies will change. New Spirit and Lutheran Church of the Foothills will come together for a year of study of contemporary Christian writings. We will meet twice a month to discuss that month's book. This new book study will be called Beyond the Book and will focus on how the book applies to real life. Locations for the meetings are still being confirmed, but we will meet in more centralized locations. To begin with, we will also offer a morning and an evening meeting time for the two days a month that we meet. More details will come as locations are confirmed. Below is the reading list for 2025.

HOMELESS BLESSINGS "BECAUSE WE CARE"



JOIN US THE 2ND SATURDAY OF EVERY MONTH OCTOBER THROUGH APRIL, 1PM TO 3PM

Our next event is on December 14th from 1pm to 3pm. We will be serving a Christmas meal

Our events are not just for the unhoused, but for anyone experiencing financial/food insecurity. In addition to the supplies such as tents, tarps, umbrellas, beanies and gloves for our homeless friends, we offer a hot meal, hygiene products, pet food, clothing, shoes, blankets, some packaged food, haircuts, and a place for some social activity for everyone.

OUR ACTIVITIES ARE NOT LIMITED TO JUST 1 DAY PER MONTH

We pack 100 "homeless bags" per month, which include a flashlight, hygiene, 1st aid, food, and a clothing item. These bags are carried in the car to be given away to an unhoused friend.

In November, we delivered coffee beans, a coffee grinder, rice, beans, and cereal to San Juan Bautista Lutheran Church located at 1130 E Bilby Road. They will deliver these items to a refugee center in Nogales, Sonora, Mexico. We also donate excess clothing to Casas Alitas Welcome Center in Tucson.

Several times this year, we attended volunteer events to assemble care packets for the unsheltered community with the City of Tucson's Housing First Team.

We are an active member of Tucson Pima Collaboration to End Homelessness, a coalition of Tucson area organizations, committed to the mission of ending homelessness in Tucson and Pima County.
