#### Dear Partners in the Gospel,

I'm not sure if I'm up for another "campaign season" as we look forward to the 2020 elections. I say that because sound bites echo loudly in the media, while real matters of life and life's struggles are shifted to "the back burner." With divergent and confusing accusations rising daily there is a reality of life that goes unnoticed.

Public housing in Tucson is rare. As many of you know we have welcomed the eastside homeless camp residents to share Wednesday evening suppers, and Homeless Blessings each 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of the month. Public housing is an economic matter. Tucson could house every homeless person in protected housing. We could, if we wanted to.

Medical costs have increased hyperbolically, as regulations are eased on big pharma. We have members and neighbors who are having to decide whether to cut their pills in half, or in quarters....or buy food. That is the reality of life today.

Insurance costs rise, scams seek to defraud us of our liquid cash. Utilities have risen steadily over the past decade. While the news will report "incomes have risen 13% in the past year, most of that increase is a result of mandates to raise the minimum wage. That 13% is not making anybody, rich. It's not.

Well, happy Epiphany! Now for an alternative-reality. The season of Epiphany shines a spotlight on Jesus, the baby of the Bethlehem stable, now baptized and let loose in the world. Jesus stands in the spotlight, and calls us to step-up to the radical call of grace and mercy. See, neither of those topics comes to the evening news. Neither of them are mentioned on Fox, CNN, MSNBC, or any news outlet. How come? Why have we grown silent about the just treatment of our brothers and sisters? Why do we continue to hold up our NIMBY signs....not in my backyard? Who are we seeking to protect? Is it us?

If so, this year I want to invite you to commit to worship every Sunday remaining in 2019. We are in "the Year of Luke." And when you come to worship you will hear Jesus calling us to live......differently. He is going to tell us in the Parables, like the Good Samaritan, and the Prodigal Son. Jesus is going to hold up a mirror reflecting the world we live in, and he will frame that view with a radical call to mercy, and giving grace. Jesus is the one voice that can re-order this life with the truth of God's justice.

I believe that this year, particularly, God is going to call us to "get out of our heads and into the world." Jesus is going to show us in very practical terms how love, grace and mercy practiced together produce the life-blood of communities.

This year, I will be encouraging you to re-orient your world views. Jesus will ask us to step away from our food waste, from our wasted physical energy, from our cynical attitudes toward how this community works....and teach you ways to share more often, and to demand less often. I want to encourage you to develop your lovelanguage, and to set aside the criticisms and complaints. I want to cheer you on as you set time aside everyday to pray for this world, and those who are the least, the last, the little, and the lone.

It is February in the desert, and we have room to grow. ...in lots of areas in our lives. Will you join me on the journey?

## Confirmation Class Did you know the "new" Confirmation Class has TEN students???

What does this mean for our life together? A ton. I am so excited to offer these young people the ways of grace, and the promise of mercy. I am ready to teach them new (to them) games, my favorite of which is called "Animals". I want to prep these youth for camp, for Super Group and for the next ELCA National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis in June, 2021.

I am so excited to have these young people now looking at matters of faith!

So.....I need something from all of you. I need you to introduce yourself to each of our youth. I need for you to befriend one or two. Tell them about you, your life, your work, your family, your fears, your dreams, your joys. I need for you to make a covenant with the youth and their parents that you are willing to shepherd them through the coming 17 months.

I invite you to join me on **Sunday, February 24<sup>th</sup> between services** in Room 105. I will invite you to meet our youth, and make a commitment to one of them for the coming 17 months, until May, 2020. You will accompany the youth through their confirmation time. You will learn about their school and home life. You will learn about their dreams and desires. And you will be the presence of God's grace and mercy to them.

In the coming weeks we will publish a "Teen Covenant Statement" that will connect you with one of our "kids." I think this is a very, very important step to take with these youth. We have ten Confirmation students...that's insane!!!!



Easter is very late this year, Sunday, April 21<sup>st</sup>. The Season of Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 6<sup>th</sup>. Midweek Lenten Services will be held at 6:15 p.m. after Suppers on Wednesdays.

#### Food Bank Vegetable, Fruit and Bread Distribution


