Dear Partners in the Gospel,

This past Fall the Praise Team introduced a song entitled "No Matter What." Its lyrics are kind of haunting, yet kind of relieving. They speak of the difficulty of living our lives in this broken world, and the effects that brokenness has upon our hearts and souls. We don't have to look too far to see that brokenness. And then, comes the chorus that affirms and reaffirms the promise.....that God's love comes to us, no matter what you've done.

As we seek to do the ministry of the Church of Jesus Christ here in east Tucson, it can be easy to think the ministry is here for us. The promise of forgiveness is "for us." The grace of God, love unbound, is "for us." The buildings, heating/air conditioning, food during coffee fellowship is "for us." But, that isn't the mission of the church. That forgiveness we claim is for the strangers we avoid (xenophobia), and those we deem enemies (enmity). If our faith and trust in Jesus has become more of an entitlement to us, than a calling to share the Good News with our neighbors, then I have failed you.

My oft-mentioned "lazy-boy recliner of faith" is that very "entitled" position that I have preached and taught about. The comfort of our "beliefs" can become the limiter of our faith. Jesus calls us to follow, not to sit in our same-old-places. Jesus speaks to us in images that are intended to stretch our common notions, while encouraging us to look further and deeper into our living relationship with the living God.

The church council will be going on retreat at the end of this month, and we will do the difficult work of looking beyond our "good-enough" ministry mentality to become a better and more vibrant ministry.

The season of Epiphany is the time that the spotlight of heaven shines upon Jesus. He is the reason for our hope and faith. He has shown us the nature of God's welcoming love. He has shown us the wide open arms of mercy that are stretched to welcome everyone no matter their political persuasion, immigration status, economic confidence, medical condition, various dependencies and addictions, and hopes. This is the time we get to be church. While many will reminisce about days gone by, the reality of 2020 is what we have. The same issues matter: what is our commitment to teaching our children and youth of God's grace in Jesus? What is our commitment to welcome, no, to invite people to witness the Gospel celebrated at New Spirit? What will be our next new adventure?

"Faith is not a destination. It is the journey of a lifetime born in the waters of our baptism and leading us confidently into unknown futures until even, the moment of our final breath." From then on, it'll be a party and a feast. How about you?

## Why the Senegal trip?

In the days following Christmas, Bishop Deborah and I flew to Senegal, Africa to meet with Lutheran pastors and their Bishop Adama Faye (rhymes with sigh). The Lutheran Church of Senegal is our Global Ministry Companion Church. We went to continue the process called "Accompaniment" by the ELCA.

In the Gospel of Luke (24:13-35) is the story of two men who were walking back to their village, Emmaus, on Easter evening. Luke tells us that as they walked, Jesus accompanied them. On that journey they spoke of many things. "Accompaniment ministry" draws people to walk with one another on this journey of faith. For the past eight years, small groups of Grand Canyon Synod members have travelled to Senegal to meet the members of the Senegalese Lutheran Church. In the past years groups of Senegalese Lutherans have come to the States, particularly the Grand Canyon Synod, and have visited and experienced ministry in a number of settings. Last January a group of young adults visited Arizona and were introduced to a few of our congregations, and the sites of living in God's favorite place! A snowstorm altered their plans, so they could drive to Flagstaff and see snow fall for the first time in their lives! We met those five young people and were amazed by their stories and excited recall of new friends made.

President Adama Faye was our guide, driver, dinner companion, and host for our eight days there. He is a most gracious and wise man, all of 36 years old! We ate dinner with his family one night. We saw many sites, and in the months to come I will share more about our trip, but more, more about the Lutheran Church in Senegal which is filled with a lively and powerful Spirit calling them to proclaim the Good News. It was both amazing and humbling to see their work, and hear about their amazing faith. We could learn a thing or two. We'll see.



## Conversations on the Refugee Crisis

Although the news has turned its cameras away from refugee detention facilities, the plight of families and children continues. The Christian Church has always been a safe-place for refugees seeking safety for their children, and the promise of a better life that we call the "American Dream."



In five video-discussions participants will learn about refugee ministry, and the possibilities that give hope to those who seek a better life for their children.

# **Our Lenten Journey**

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26<sup>th</sup>.



Lent begins Ash Wednesday – Feb. 26th This year, with so many of our members unable to come out after dark, we will offer a **Spoken Service of Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion at 4 p.m.** We will offer an evening service as well at 6:30 p.m. for families with children and those who work. There will be a **potluck supper at 5:30 p.m.** for those attending the services.



## DO YOU KNOW HOW MUCH NEW SPIRIT MAKES A DIFFERENCE?

Since my article last year, we have seen New Spirit furthering our community outreach efforts, locally and internationally. Interfaith Community Services and Community Food Bank of Southern Arizona, along with the Medical Loan Chest have expanded. The community garden continues to provide healthy food choices. Blessings in a Backpack and Homeless Blessings have grown to include more hungry children (10,200 weekend snack packs) and adults (500 last year from our monthly events) being served. Thanksgiving Dinner at Arizona Beer House has increased in size each year to share a meal with more people (this year was our 4<sup>th</sup>!). The tax site prepared 1200 tax returns last year. Meals from the Heart delivers food to our homebound members.

New Spirit Women in Ministry supports many causes: Ronald McDonald House and the Navajo Mission School in Mexico; Fellowship of the Least Coin (international organization that give grants throughout the world in Christian projects); St Matthews Church (ordinary plastic screw caps from bottles for breast cancer mammograms in Mexico); prepares family meals during memorial services; funds for NSLC project backpacks; financial assistance for a medical nurse, Brittany, on a ship docked off the coast of Africa; cards to New Spirit shut-ins; funds to Shriners for transportation costs to bring children from Mexico to Tucson clinics; funds to Lutheran World Relief for the Bahamas storm; funds to help with meals delivered to New Spirit shut-ins.

Sunday School is teaching our children about a life of service to Christ and our community by gathering items for Lutheran Social Services' refugees. Last year, 40 comfort bags were delivered to the Cancer Center at University Medical Center; 200 Christmas cards with music CDs were sent to Veterans; 20 Christmas cards were sent to our NSLC shut-ins. They are also making scarves for Wings for Women, an organization dedicated to empowering homeless and impoverished women and children.

New Spirit can do even more to spread Jesus' love and mercy....with your help. It doesn't have to be physically challenging. You can write thank you notes and cards, make phone calls to shut-ins, answer phones, talk with people.

What are your God given talents? Learn them and use them. Find a team that shares your passions and start now.

## Feed My Starving Children - Feb 8th - Church of the Nazarene, Oro Valley

Feed My Starving Children is a food-ministry that provides nutritionally-engineered meals for children suffering from malnutrition in 109 countries around the world. These meal-pouches are assembled at "packing events" by volunteers.



The weekend of Feb 7-9 they are planning to pack one-million meals. We have been assigned to do our packing session at Church of the Nazarene in Oro Valley, 500 W. Calle Concordia. Our packing time is 10:15-12:15.

We will carpool from New Spirit. Please be ready to leave at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 8<sup>th</sup>. If you drive yourself to Church of the Nazarene, please arrive there by 10:00 to check in. We will arrive at 10:00, check in, and have an orientation by a FMSC staff person.

The packing event is fun, with lots of great music, and it even gets a bit competitive as packing stations fill cases of meal packs.

The work is not strenuous, nor weight-laden. Our members will comprise a number of packing stations (8 persons per station).

Feed My Starving Children is supported by volunteers who pack. The New Spirit Endowment has supported Feed My Starving Children for 15 years. Our grants to FMSC will cover the cost of New Spirit members. If you'd like to support FMSC you are welcome to write a check on that morning.

We ask you to wear one of your New Spirit T-shirts: "I Love my Church", or "Have you been Mercified", or "God's Work, Our Hands."



The Grand Canyon Synod Assembly will be held June 11-12 in Las Vegas, at Community Lutheran Church. Among the guests at the Assembly will be President Adama Faye, of the Senegalese Lutheran Church.
