#### **'WIN THE WAIT'**

We didn't think of this slogan, "Win the Wait." We got it from a pastor friend who—as far as we know—may also have gotten it from someone else. But, even though it's not original, we think it perfectly captures the opportunity we have right now at New Spirit.

Our congregation just gave a ringing endorsement to the Growing Season plan, approving it by a vote of 56 to 2 at our Annual Meeting. (See p. 2 for all the results from Annual Meeting voting.) That's an energetic "Let's go!" It's a green light to get started with everything from getting the word out with high-quality postcards to organizing ourselves to follow up effectively with visitors.

But ... well ... clearly the time isn't yet right to implement those kinds of things. So we wait.

But we don't have to wait idly. At our February Church Council meeting, our new collection of council members talked over a revised time-line for aspects of the Growing Season plan and made concrete plans to start on those things we *can* start on. And it turns out there is a lot we can do, even as we wait for a return to in-person worship, and even as we wait for a time when inviting people to come join us will make more sense.

There are opportunities, right now, for you to be part of winning the wait. Are you excited by the idea of reaching new people and inviting them into a relationship with Jesus Christ and with our congregation? Your gifts and enthusiasm are needed for the Evangelism Team.

Are you committed to growing in generosity and helping others do the same? Our Stewardship Team will be working to foster a culture of generosity at New Spirit.

Get in touch with Pastor Carol if you're feeling called in either of those directions, or if you just have questions and want to talk about possibilities.

That's how we can Win the Wait—by getting busy. Waiting doesn't have to be empty time. It can be a time of preparation and even excitement.

What can we be doing? We can work on clarifying our understanding of the people around us whom we want to reach. We can design outreach materials with those folks in mind, even though they may not go out just yet. We can take a look at our space and think about any minor changes that would make it even more friendly to newcomers. And, of course, we can continue to grow deeper spiritually and work on our comfort level, talking about our faith. That way, when we meet new people, we'll be better prepared to share what we've found in Jesus Christ and what he can mean for them.

How can you, personally, contribute to the win? Pray for New Spirit, pray for the people who aren't here yet, and pray that God will show you how you can best be part of a season of growth in our congregation.

Remember what Paul said about the church in Corinth: "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow" (1 Corinthians 3:6). We can all be waterers, helping to keep things at our beloved church healthy and growing.

Let's make the most of the time, and ask God to use us in his Upper Story work!

#### **ANNUAL MEETING VOTES TALLIED**

Our Annual Congregational Meeting for 2020 happened in two parts: an informational meeting online, with presentations and discussion, followed by mail-in voting. There were no nominations from the "floor" or amendments to the Growing Season proposal or the proposed budget.

Here are the results of voting:

The Growing Season proposal was adopted by a vote of 56 to 2.

The budget was approved by a vote of 55 to 2.

Jenny Kwapich received 56 votes to be elected president.

Robin Hughes received 57 votes to be elected vice-president.

Shelley Colwell received 54 voters to be elected secretary.

Susan Armstrong received 51 votes to be elected as a council member at large.


Joyce Dow received 58 votes to be elected as a council member at large.

**JOYCE DOW** Member at Large


