2021 ANNUAL MEETING IN THE BOOKS

We were able to hold the 2021 Annual Congregational Meeting in person ,on January 9, 2022, just making our 40-member quorum. At the meeting, the congregation:



- approved the 2020 Annual Meeting minutes,
- heard comments on the past year and the year ahead from our president and one of the pastors,
- re-elected Jenny Kwapich as president and Robin Hughes as VP,
- elected John Lukecart as a member-at-large of the Church Council,
- elected Cathy Cermak and Carol Debis-Harrell to the Endowment Board,
- heard an overview of our financial situation, and
- adopted a budget for 2022.

The office of Treasurer continues to be unfilled, as we haven't been able to identify anyone with the gifts and the willingness to take it on. Currently, the work of the treasurer is being handled by the Finance Team, with Pastor Fred as the point person.

Also noteworthy is New Spirit's financial position. On the one hand, our income vs. expenses are running roughly \$1000 short per week. On the other hand, our overall assets stand at \$4.9 million, up \$463,764 over this point last year. The budget that we proposed and adopted includes a plan to draw from restricted funds, as needed, to cover ongoing expenses.

We have been able to begin to implement some efforts under the Growing Season initiative that had been delayed by COVID. If God blesses those efforts, we have hopes of seeing our congregation grow, with new faces, new energy, and new resources adding to our life together.

SEEKING A NEW PASTOR

Since Pastor Alan Field retired from New Spirit at the end of May 2020, we have been looking toward this time when we would launch the process of finding our next "settled" pastor. (That's the current term for a pastor called by the congregation with an open-ended call.)

The call process has two parts: one led by a Transition Team, the next handled by a Call Committee. The Transition Team leads the congregation in self-study—looking back at our history and forward toward the next chapter. This culminates in the team compiling the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), a document that is shared with potential pastoral candidates to tell them who we are and what particular gifts and skills we hope for in our next pastoral leader.


As the MSP is being completed, our Church Council appoints a Call Committee. That committee receives a corresponding document (the Rostered Minister Profile or RMP) from people interested in interviewing for the position of pastor at New Spirit. More on that when the time comes.

For now, your Transition Team has put a paper timeline out on tables in the sanctuary entryway for you to note events, ministries, etc., throughout our history. This is to help us reflect together on the life of our congregation so far. The team will also be using surveys, small group get-togethers, and one-on-one meetings to gather your thoughts on who we are, where we've been, where we're going, and what kind of pastor we want/need to lead us in the years ahead.

The team's plan is to use the next six weeks to gather input via the timeline and various brief surveys. Then March and April will be the time for small-group and one-on-one conversations. They'll also be able to assemble some of the basic factual content of the MSP during the time between now and the end of April. Then it will likely take two to four weeks to finish writing and polishing the MSP before it gets submitted.

Serving on the Transition Team are Barb Verthein, Brigitte Stuetze, Judy McFarland, and Cathy Cermak. They are happy to talk with you!

The Grand Canyon Synod is providing us with a coach to help with both parts of this process, but especially to work with the Call Committee. Our original coach, Deacon Janice Zimbelman, has moved into the position of Director of Transitions for our synod and the Rocky Mountain Synod and has turned over coaching responsibility for New Spirit to her husband, Pastor Glenn Zimbelman.



Watch for lots more in the weeks ahead! And please be sure your voice is heard during this self-study period.

New Year, New Faces, New Spirit



Despite another awful COVID surge, things are beginning to stir here at New Spirit. At the beginning of January, we boldly sent out nearly 18,000 specially-designed postcards to our neighbors, inviting them to rediscover their God-given purpose in life. We struck a chord, and people are responding. We're seeing more people checking out our website, watching our online messages on YouTube, reaching out to set up spiritual growth coaching conversations, and showing up for worship on Sunday mornings.

This is exciting and encouraging and an answer to prayer! But it's also just the beginning. Research and experience teach us that there are no silver bullets, no easy fixes, and no room for complacency. That's why our Evangelism Team is going to double down and get working on our *next* large postcard mailing, probably this spring. Even as we each seek to find a purpose driven life for our personal lives, we also want to be a purpose driven church—working together to help people find their deeper purpose and abundant life in Christ.

As we do our part in this God-pleasing, life-changing work, we're asking all of you to do your part. Here's what we're asking...

Pray. Really Pray. Ask the Lord to bless all those who are responding to our postcard, that they might find or rediscover God's purpose for them.

Introduce yourself. Go out of your way to warmly welcome new faces around you. And please wear your nametag to make it easier for them to connect names and faces.

Pitch in. Consider being one of our brownie bakers, visitor packet deliverers, or greeters. It's meaningful and impactful work.

Spread the word. Grab a handful of excess postcards and leave a little stack where others can find and read them. You never know who's waiting for an invitation to rediscover their purpose.

Join the team. If you'd like to explore being an active part of a really vital ministry team, just talk to any of us. STUCK? TRY SPIRITUAL GROWTH COACHING

It's hard not to feel like we're living in a bad dream these days. It's easy to feel stuck, like nothing is changing, or, at least, nothing is changing for the better. Whether it starts with spiritual stuck-ness or the spiritual stuck-ness follows from other aspects of life, we can find ourselves spinning our wheels, living without a strong sense of hope and forward momentum.



That's a good time to try Spiritual Growth Coaching. The whole point of this kind of coaching is to help you move off the dime and toward whatever growth you're looking and longing for in your life.

Someone being coached usually meets with their coach about once a month to talk through how things are going and make a plan for the month ahead, taking into account both potential pitfalls and hoped-for benefits. Currently about a dozen New Spirit folks are getting coached. We've also invited people in the community around us, via postcard, to give Spiritual Growth Coaching a try. Five New Spiriters are going to be trained in this kind of coaching via a Zoom workshop in February.


FIND YOUR GOD-GIVEN PURPOSE

LUTHERAN ADVOCACY MINISTRY IN ARIZONA NEWS

The Lutheran Advocacy Day at the Legislature is scheduled for February. 1, 2022, in the Capitol Rose Garden from 8:30 to 10:30 AM. Lutherans from throughout Arizona are planning to attend this opportunity to share bagels and drinks with our Arizona legislators. The purpose of this meeting is to make our legislators aware of our concerns about hunger awareness so that we may learn, witness, and voice our common needs in the public square through our faith and love.

Representatives from the Arizona Food Bank Network, Bread for the World, Wheat, Pinnacle Prevention, and more will be there with us to advocate for hunger needs. One of the speakers is our own Bishop Hutterer, who will also deliver the invocation in the State House at 1:15.

Another issue of interest is the chance to offer our opinions on legislative issues in 2022 as the legislature was scheduled to convene on January 10. If you are interested in learning more about how to be a part of this process, you may access this information by registering via the LAMAz.org website.

After a member of LAMA receives your information, that representative of LAMA will go to the capitol to register you in the Right to Speak system. In the past, you would have had to be physically present in Phoenix at the Capitol to participate. Now LAMA may register for you so that you can access information on bills at home or in your office.
