Beloved of God,

We have made it to 2024! I pray that this year has started off on a positive foot for all of you. I must admit that I am excited for the coming months. My family and I don't set New Year's Resolutions, but we do take some time to reflect on the previous year as well as set some S.M.A.R.T. Goals. What are S.M.A.R.T. Goals? They are goals that are Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-Bound.

For example, instead of setting a resolution of "I want to be more physically active", the smart goal could be by the end of the year I will record 10,000 steps 5 out of 7 days a week. This is one of my goals for the coming year. At one point in time, I would hit 10,000 steps before lunch most days of the week.

We can also set smart goals for the congregation, recognizing that sometimes God laughs at our plans and goals. One smart goal that individual members of the congregation could take on is, inviting one new person a month to attend worship or an event at the church. We averaged a Sunday attendance of 68 last year. If each of those 68 people invited 1 new person a month for 12 months, that would equal 816 new people being invited to "come and see". Even if only 10% said "yes" that is almost 100 people attending and experiencing what God is doing here. If 10% of those 100 people became regular attenders during the year, we would once again see 10% growth for the year. And to think it all is built on each of you inviting 1 new person per month, imagine if everyone invited 2, 3, or even 4 person per month.

So is there a S.M.A.R.T. goal you can set to help grow New Spirit and extend the message of the gospel?

You will see that this month's newsletter is a little shorter then normal. This is because Nancy and others are hard at work finalizing materials for the Annual Meeting. February will see a return to the typical length of our monthly newsletter. A huge thanks goes out to all those who are hard at work preparing for the annual meeting.

In 2024 we will be spending our time reading about poverty and related issues. Jennifer Brown created the Ally Continuum, the four "stages" of being an ally are Apathetic, Aware, Active, and Advocate. The first three stages rely heavily on education. As a church that serves those that are homeless and food insecure, we must continue to learn about the struggles of those that we serve as well as about the systems at play. If you are unable to join us for the monthly discussion groups, you are still encouraged to read the books.

### A Word from Worship & Music

I'm looking forward to what Pastor has in store for us during the month of January. This is year B of the Lectionary, for those of you who follow that kind of stuff. The Gospel readings will be primarily from Mark, with a bit of John sprinkled in during the year. January 14 begins Epiphany, the season during which Jesus is revealed as the Light of the World to all. It's also during this time that Jesus calls the disciples to follow him. While we try to follow this theme in music for the month, who knows what Pastor's inspiration might hold for us?

You may have noticed that we have sung the same sending song for a month or so during the past few months. There are several reasons for this. One, we may be introducing a new song to you, and repetition helps everyone learn it. Two, the sending songs have usually been thematic to what else is happening during worship. For instance, during the Stewardship Appeal, we sang Matthew West's "Do Something," to encourage everyone to action. We did "You Don't Knock," an old spiritual, to remind us all of God's abundant grace. And during Advent when our theme was waiting for Jesus in a hurting and troubled world, we sang "One Day," by Cochran and Company, to provide hope.

During Epiphany we will introduce a new song, "Change on the Rise," by Avi Kaplan. You got a glimpse of this song from the video we played a couple of weeks ago. This song is sort of a secular crossover song, that certainly fits our hope for a better world as we enter a new year, as well as New Spirit's theme of Creating a Culture of Compassion.

The Worship and Music Committee hopes that worship will be sacred and impactful for you. Please do not hesitate to let us know if you have any questions, suggestions, or new songs (whether hymns or contemporary tunes) that you would like to hear. Robert Encila, our Worship Leader, heads the committee. Other members include Cathy Cermak, Joyce Dow, Renee Geiger, Paul Stuetze and Pastor Hartman.
