Dear Partners in the Gospel,

Have you ever had a once-in-a-lifetime experience? Maybe it was a vacation, a cruise, a tour or event that you had planned and prepared for. Maybe it was a reunion, or even a chance run-in with an old friend, or people of some celebrity. What has been your once-in-a-lifetime experience?

In the Lutheran Church there are some once-in-a-lifetime moments: your baptism, first communion, confirmation. This year six of our youth are experiencing a once-in-a-lifetime event in Houston. 35,000 Lutheran youth will be gathered for five days of inspiring worship, speakers, music, activities, and more: For You Have Been Saved by Grace: This Changes Everything. For most of these youth, the largest Lutheran youth gathering has been at SALCA camps. But, to see 35,000 youth together in a sports stadium, dancing to the music and singing the songs is breath-taking. Seeing the corporate faith of that many young people can impress upon our youth what God can do when the faithful gather. We are going to experience a whole host of activities and events in Houston that are intended to connect the faith of our heads with the presence of the Spirit in our hearts. When that connection is made in a young person, it can be truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

After we return, these young people will be leading worship on August 5<sup>th</sup> to share how God got their attention in Houston. I always look forward to what the youth will share about how God moved them. We'll see how that happens for our kids.

Did you know that the most frequently identified moment in the lives of young adult Lutherans, that time when God "spoke their name and filled them with the Spirit's power" was......at Summer Bible Camp. I believe deeply that when we offer the Word of God in a non-competitive, non-partisan community the lives of those youth will be impacted for years and years to come.

I am confident that youth have a <u>window of opportunity</u> to experience the grace of God. The challenge is where that window will fit when school activities, sports practices and games, and developing those adolescent relationships are so important. How can we better connect the children and youth of New Spirit with that "community connection" this Fall?

A second source of strength in development for pre-teens and teens is a positive conversant relationship with an adult who is not their parent or family. While we know the gift that grandparents are; when a child or youth has an adult friend, who is not their parent, they have a jump on confidence, faith-talk, and the skills to develop good interactive relationships.

I wonder how many New Spirit members could name our confirmation students? I wonder how many of you have ever talked with our confirmands about how their life, school, athletics, and church intersect. Have you ever talked to these kids? I encourage you to do so!

I want to remind you of one more thing mid-summer. We are having guests on Sunday mornings. We only get one chance to make a first impression. I need for you to introduce yourself to our Sunday morning guests. We have had guests each week, and I am not sure if we care making the connection that will encourage them to return next Sunday. The people we have had have enjoyed worship, but the "tell" if they will come back to New Spirit is if someone took the chance to welcome a stranger. You know what I say, "We begin as strangers, but soon the Spirit makes strangers friends, and friends family.

The Grand Canyon Synod Assembly was held at Resurrection Lutheran Church in Oro Valley on June 14-16. The agenda was full, but was focused upon the process to elect a new Bishop for the Synod. After 5 ballots the Rev. Deborah Hutterer was elected to the office of Bishop of the Grand Canyon Synod. Her term is six years. We pray God's blessing upon her ministry leading the Grand Canyon Synod into this new chapter of ministry. Pastor Deborah has worked with Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest for the past 5 years, and before that served churches in Illinois, and Minnesota.

Pastor Deborah is the first female Bishop for the Grand Canyon Synod, and joins a host of newly elected women from across the ELCA as newly elected Bishops. God is doing an amazing thing in the life of the ELCA.



<u>God's Work – Our Hands</u> day is September 8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup> throughout the ELCA. Across the country Lutherans from thousands of congregations will be putting on their yellow t-shirts and doing projects to help their neighborhoods. Last year, New Spirit members created four community garden beds at Erickson Elementary School. On May 13<sup>th</sup> a staff member of Erickson Elementary shared with the congregation the school's and the students' thanks and appreciation for the gardens and our Blessings in a Backpack ministry.
