GROWING SEASON UPDATE

We are so grateful to be able to be together in person again, and we expect renewed energy to come from that. But our Growing Season work is already underway.



Here's what's happening with the Growing Season plan adopted by the congregation at New Spirit's annual meeting in January:

Evangelism: The Evangelism Team is meeting regularly, working to develop a good understanding of the people around us who we want to reach with the gospel and with an invitation to grow in faith at New Spirit. Contact Pastor Fred if you'd like to participate in the Evangelism Team or if you have questions or comments.

In addition, we are offering a One-Minute Faith Stories workshop in July to help us get more comfortable sharing our faith with others. (See article on p. 4)

First Impressions Team: The First Impressions Team has met and is considering small projects that could improve the impression we make on first-time visitors. If you're interested in being part of the First Impressions Team, contact Jenny Kwapich at jennykwapich@gmail.com.

Growing Deeper: Along with small groups that meet weekly for Bible study, we're also offering Spiritual Growth Coaching to anyone and everyone. At this point, nine New Spirit members are getting coached, and there's plenty of room for more. See the article on p. 3 for more on Spiritual Growth Coaching.

Worship: We are actively advertising for a worship leader and an organist/pianist for worship. If you know someone who has a strong singing voice and an engaging personality, plays guitar or keyboard, and is a follower of Jesus Christ, please ask them if they would be open to talking about our worship leader position. Ditto if you know a pianist or organist.

COVID AND WORSHIP

The first thing to say about COVID-19 and worship is: Praise the Lord that, in our part of the world, we seem to have turned the corner on this pandemic. The second thing to say would be a fervent prayer that world leaders will find a way to get a vaccine into lots of arms around the world in the next weeks and months.

Meanwhile, at New Spirit, we celebrate the new guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) that says that fully vaccinated people can be indoors and outdoors, in groups large and small, without wearing masks.

Our Church Council has determined that we will change our policy beginning Sunday, June 13, to allow for those who are fully vaccinated to come to worship mask less. The delay is to give the more hesitant among us some time to adjust to this new reality.

Just FYI: We will *not* be asking to see proof of vaccination. We *will* be honoring the vaccination status or simply the preference of anyone wearing a mask by maintaining distance from them and continuing some worship practices in a COVID-safe manner for however long that is appropriate.

COACHING FOR SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Most of us feel stuck in some part of our lives at some points in our lives. And one place where that can easily happen is in our spiritual lives. We can find ourselves in the spiritual doldrums or simply notice that it's been a while since we felt the joy of growing closer to God.

How to shake free from stuckness and begin to see growth and forward momentum? You have one good tool at your disposal: Spiritual Growth Coaching.

Spiritual Growth Coaching takes the coaching model and applies it to your life of faith. Your coach meets you where you are and helps you think through where you want to be and how best to start to move in that direction.

A coach will ordinarily meet with you about once a month to help you plan and to help you hold yourself accountable to your plan. Of course, if something isn't working, then you'll talk it through together and you can make adjustments or just start fresh. The point is to grow deeper in faith and closer to Christ, so that your life is more and more fulfilling and joyful.

YOU, TOO, CAN SHARE YOUR FAITH

When you want to tell someone about your faith and what Jesus means for your life, does it seem like you forgot how to talk? Does your mind go blank and your vocabulary disappear?

If so, you're not alone. A lot of us grew up not hearing people share their faith easily and openly. So, when we try to speak that language, it isn't right there for us. But that doesn't mean we can't learn!

On Sunday, July 11, Pastor Carol will lead a workshop called "One-Minute Faith Stories." We will meet in the Fellowship Hall at about 11:30, after worship and fellowship time, and wrap up around 12:30. Lunch will be provided.

This workshop will help you prepare a response for any time someone asks you about your faith in Jesus. We'll talk about what makes for a good, but brief, faith story. Then you'll spend some time starting to put together a one-minute faith story that's true to who you are and your unique experience. You'll come away with something you can share in a minute—not too much, not too little—to start a conversation or pique someone's interest.



This workshop will be fun and low-pressure. And only God knows the difference it will make for you and for someone you get a chance to share with.
