Women's Ministry Group (WELCA Bible Study Group) met at 1:30 on May 10, 2023, at the church.

Our Bible Study was Reviving the Soul, reviewing Commandments seven, eight, nine and ten. In our study of the commandments, we have used one of the simplest methods of biblical interpretation allow Scripture to interpret Scripture. Placing various texts of the Bible side by side, we've seen that Scripture itself teaches us humility. There is no single correct way and, other than Jesus, no single perfect keeper of the commandments.
