#### THE WHOLE WORLD IN HIS HANDS

In Sunday school and at Vacation Bible School when I was a kid, we'd sing, "He's got the whole world in his hands." The "he" is God, and, in the song, the "whole world" includes: the wind and the rain; the little bitty babies; you and me, brother; you and me, sister; and everybody here. When I sang this song as a girl, I pictured God holding a blue ball with patches of bright green grass, little trees protruding from the surface, and happy little bunnies hopping here and there.



Recently, though, when I called up that song in my memory to try to reassure myself about the state of the world, the picture that came into my head was of God tossing the world back and forth from one hand to the other like a hot potato. The world is hot—hot temperatures and hot-spots of war, hunger, racism, sickness, authoritarianism, and ...well, the list goes on. Is God, just maybe, tempted to drop the ball? Are we moving toward a point where God might say, "I promised Noah I wouldn't destroy the world again by a flood, but I *do* have other options"?

Only God knows. But God does know.

Even if it's not bunnies and bright green grass, it's still so very reassuring to know that there's something (some *one*) greater than the world. God is bigger, greater, wiser. God surpasses our world and our galaxy. Certainly God's power to create and recreate surpasses our power to mess up, screw up, and destroy.

It's humbling to realize that we don't and can't know how this period in world history will play out. But it's both humbling and encouraging to look at how Christians before us have responded when the world around them was dangerous and key aspects of civilized society were under attack.

Someone like Dietrich Bonhoeffer, from our Lutheran tradition, who stood up to the power of the Third Reich—who gave his life but he didn't surrender his faith. The conditions in which he lived may, in fact, have led him to rely more fully on his Lord and less on his own evident giftedness.

Or, Christians in China, where the faith is officially discouraged, are nevertheless adding numbers at an amazing rate. For example, a credible scholarly source estimates that the number of Christians in China grew by almost 40% between 2006 and 2010. Not long ago, the government had every cross removed from every house of worship in one area, only to see the faith hold on and thrive.

On a smaller scale is the simple, everyday, faithful believer who suffers hard losses and finds that prayer is the essential practice that gets her through each day. Staying connected to God literally allows her to keep going, keep breathing, and even begin to experience joy again.

Does adversity actually help us to recognize, accept, and even rejoice in our dependence on God in a way that's harder to do when we feel we're on top of things...or will be again soon?

There's spiritual freedom in letting go of the (false) sense that I have control over my future, much less over the future of my country or the world. It's the freedom we claim when we sing, "My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness." It's the freedom of truly believing what the apostle Paul wrote in Romans: that there is absolutely nothing that can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.

In the face of a world that's too hot for us to handle, trusting that God can and will handle it frees us from paralyzing worry and frees us up to do what we can to make whatever difference we can.

Our loving, redeeming God, the God who created this blue ball we live on and all the people on it—our hope is built on nothing less than his saving love. It's enough. It's more than enough.

It has been very much a blessing to be able to be part of your church community over the past year, and I want to thank you for allowing me to learn more about pastoral ministry and to share in the challenges we all have faced together this past year. #### 2022 GRAND CANYON SYNOD ASSEMBLY IN THE BOOKS

Barb Verthein, Laurie Bernard, and Pastor Carol (along with about 220 other people) attended the 2022 Assembly of the Grand Canyon Synod, held early in June at Love of Christ Lutheran Church in Mesa.

As the highest decision-making body in the synod, the assembly adopted a budget (mission spending plan) and held elections. We elected synod council members and voting members for the next ELCA Churchwide Assembly, to be held in August in Columbus, Ohio.

One of the highlights of the assembly was a presentation by Rev. Roberto Trejo Haager, pastor president of Iglesia Luterana Mexicana (ILM). Bishop Deborah Hutterer, Synod Vice President Barbara Carl, and Rev. Trejo signed a covenant officially recognizing our synod's partnership with ILM. This is the Grand Canyon Synod's second international partnership. We are connected in the same way with the Lutheran Church of Senegal.

Bishop Hutterer reported that, thanks to the generosity of our congregations, the \$500,000 goal of the synod's Growing Generosity appeal was met in just one year. A new "stretch goal" of \$750,000 has been set. Funds raised will go toward Lutheran Campus Ministry, new and ethnic-specific ministries in the synod, and increasing advocacy efforts. Note: We did our part! When New Spirit tithed on the generous bequest from Virginia Gearhart's estate, that money went to the Growing Generosity appeal.

Democracy in Action: four days in DC.

Hunger advocates from across the country gathered in Washington, DC on June 6-7 for the 2022 Bread for the World Advocacy Summit. Solveig Muus, our LAMA director, joined colleagues for training, worship, and advocacy on Capitol Hill.

The Arizona Hunger Policy Workgroup was awarded a 2022 SPARK Grant of \$20,000 to use toward fighting hunger in Arizona.

The ELCA urges us to become more involved in countering the reality and fear of violence in our communities and our neighbors' communities in the effort to pursue justice and peace.



The ELCA resources on gun violence include "A 60-Day Journey Toward Justice in a Culture of Gun Violence." Included is an easy-to-use guide and appendix with documents and actions on gun violence.

SCHOOL IS OUT FOR SUMMER VACATION! While we won't be delivering snack packs to the children until August, we are busy replenishing the \$37,000 in funds needed to support sending home weekend food for the 2022-2023 school year.

We are fortunate to have the support of New Spirit, and also the Grand Canyon Synod, Arizona Association of School Business Officials, Community Foodbank of Southern Arizona, Jim Click Raffle, and others.

Here at New Spirit, we feed **290** children from Erickson, Ford, Steele, and Henry Elementary Schools, providing snack packs to take home on the weekend. Typical items include macaroni n' cheese box, canned sausages, chicken or tuna, oatmeal, canned beans or pasta, cereal, hot cocoa, canned vegetable, and fruit cup.
