Dear Partners on the Trail,

It rarely happens that Easter is as late as it will be this year, April 21^{st} . The season of Lent then begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6^{th} .

This year's Lenten theme will encourage participants to consider how you have responded to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and how it is reflected in your daily life. Each Wednesday evening we will consider one of six links in a chain, understanding that "a chain is only as strong as its weakest link." Through litanies, Scripture and homilies you will be called to center on each week's, or link's, theme.

I hope you and your family will make it a plan to come for supper on Wednesdays at 5:30 p.m. and worship at 6:30 p.m.

Ash Wednesday will be a service of Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

I have written in the past about the old church tradition of "giving something up for Lent." I've never been impressed by that practice, so I encourage you to add something for Lent. Add to your calendar "your commitment to worship on each Sunday and Wednesday during the 40 days of Lent." Or, you might "add to your weekly tithe a designated amount, say 1-2% of your weekly income and take note of how that would impact your daily routines at home." Or, you might "add the commitment to make a new, New Spirit friend a week", connecting with familiar faces but people whom you do not know. Or, you could "add 10 minutes after breakfast, or supper, for prayer and reading a Psalm." Or, you could "plant new plants in your yard, and tend to them each day, thanking God for the gift of life in the desert Springtime."

I invite you to make this Lenten Season one in which you add something meaningful to your daily and weekly routine so that you experience the gift of God's call to "new life."

I wish for you, a blessed Lenten Season.

Details were finalized for the group's participation (communion, ushers, luncheon help) at Sue Gilmore's memorial service to be held on February 27, 2019.



When I read this message from our bishop, Deborah Hutterer, I was remembering some of my feelings when raising my kids. There was such little time to give to the church. Paul worked 70 hours a week and all 5 kids were involved in sports. I often felt inadequate in my response to all God had given me. But then some sweet soul reminded me that what I was doing NOW was my response. So you see how the following article was worth sharing.

"The prince should think: Christ has served me and made everything to follow him; therefore, I should also serve my neighbor, protect him and everything that belongs to him. That is why God has given me this office, and I have it that I might serve him. That would be a good prince and ruler. When a prince sees his neighbor oppressed, he should think: That concerns me! I must protect and shield my neighbor....The same is true for shoemaker, tailor, scribe, or reader. If he is a Christian tailor, he will say: I make these clothes because God has bidden me do so, so that I can earn a living, so that I can help and serve my neighbor. When a Christian does not serve the other, God is not present; that is not Christian living." Martin Luther

What is a vocation?

I used to think that a vocation was some big thing. A one true grand calling in life with which we are somehow anointed.

But as I reflect on this quote from Martin Luther during this season of Epiphany, I am reminded that this is not the case.

Any work done in faith can be a vocation. We are all made holy through baptism in Christ to do holy work.

So everyday tasks of the Christian like changing diapers or cleaning the floors, or caring for an aging family member, volunteering with the Scouts, caring for one in hospice, creating a home filled with laughter, deliberating about which candidate to vote for—are tasks to which we are called.

Being faithful in your duties at home or work, or in whatever way you respond to God – YOU have a calling, a vocation as a follower of Jesus. Jesus has set you free to serve God and neighbor.

These vocations are as important as being a bishop or CEO or brain surgeon.

There is precious little in our life that can't be a place where God is at work healing, comforting, and restoring, when we look at it this way.

You, my dear brothers and sisters are saints. YOU get to complete the miracles placed on your paths. And while you are about that work, from time to time you will get glimpses of the Holy City that is written about in Revelation. We who are yet walking by faith live in hope and trust of God's word that there will be no more death. No more mourning or crying or pain. Where all things will be made new.

Two Assignments: As you do your tasks—phone calls, errands, whatever work you are called to this day—repeat this is holy work. And, for extra credit—remind someone else that they are doing holy work. You may discover that in sharing those words God will use you to bring new life.

Sunday School Happenings By Shelley Colwell



The Sunday School would like to thank all the congregation who contributed to our holiday project making comfort bags for children undergoing chemotherapy. Depending on their age one treatment on chemotherapy can last 6-8 hours. As you can imagine that is a long time to keep a young child entertained. Due to your generosity we were able to put together 40 comfort bags; 20 for girls and 20 for boys. These bags contained puzzle coloring books, gum, mints, colored pencils, tissues, hand held puzzles, crackers, writing pads, and pencil sharpeners. They were all made from soft fleece donated by members of the congregation. The Sunday school kids made the display for the congregation, packed all the bags and helped deliver them to the hospital.

We have been told the bags are already in use and the kids are enjoying them. We will be scheduling a full-scale tour of the hospital with the kids as soon as we can work out scheduling, which they are looking forward to in the upcoming weeks. The kids had also been asking whatever happened to all those bags that sat outside of the sanctuary to occupy our youngest church goers. Over the years most of the bags and contents have gone missing so we worked on replenishing the bags as well. The kids decorated and stocked new bags which will be reappearing outside the sanctuary in the next couple of weeks.

It is almost time for the Pima County Fair, and the Sunday School kids will again be entering crafts for display there. Last year they were quite successful and earned many ribbons. This was a great way for the kids to build their self-esteem. The people that coordinate the crafts at the fair were very excited to have our kids participate as they have not had churches participate, usually just schools. The kids submitted quite a variety of projects and have come up with a lot of new ideas for this year. The fair is April 17-27th this year and it would be great for the kids to hear from the congregation that their work was appreciated. Last year we heard from Pastor Alan and Marilyn and Gene Linderkamp and it was greatly appreciated!

We have been studying the book of John this Winter since Christmas. We will be transitioning to the Psalms in the next few weeks. We have acquired enough copies of the Serendipity Bible for small groups so all the kids can read from the same Bible. They also enjoy the questions that are in that Bible to facilitate discussion because it lets all of them find a meaningful answer and think a little more about the scripture meaning. We encourage the kids to read the lessons straight from the Bible themselves; even some of the kids as young as 1st grade are starting to feel confident to start reading the Bible aloud in class.



Looking forward to Spring we would also like to do another community outreach project. When we visited the hospital with the kids we found out they have their own library, so we have been discussing doing a book drive. Look for details in the coming weeks. In May we will be hosting our second annual Mother's Day tea for the moms of our Sunday School kids. We are looking forward to a busy and productive Spring term. Again, we would like to thank all of you in the congregation who have supported the kids over the years. As it says in the book of Psalms 127:3 (NLT) "Children are a gift from the Lord; they are a reward from him."



On January 25, our program was recognized with The Kindness Award from Ben's Bells for our volunteer work with Blessings in a Backpack. This school year, we are feeding 279 children from Erickson, Ford, Steele and Henry Elementary Schools, providing snack packs to take home on the weekend.

We were also blessed with oatmeal packs from a packathon at St Paul's United Methodist Church. Some of our team members participated in the packing, which will give us breakfast portions to include in our snack packs for 3 weeks.
