Disturb Us, Oh God

In the song, "Common Ground" by Matt Maher, we shout "disturb us, Oh God." That might seem a bit weird that we're asking God to disturb us, when most of us are perfectly fine seeking peaceful and content lives. So why ask that God disturb us? I believe it's because God is disturbed and heartbroken over the world and wants us to pay attention. Certainly, God is disturbed by humankind's never-ceasing striving for power, continuous divisions and hatred, wars and genocide, depraved greed and obsession for more, betrayal of creation, exploitation and oppression of others, self-serving tendencies, etc. I believe God is disturbed and angered (as evidenced by Jesus' turning over tables in the Temple) by the evil systems of injustice that continue to inflict generational abuses upon people because of their ethnicity, race, sexuality, and/or gender, and rob them of their God-given dignity and right to thrive.

To be more specific, God is disturbed by hunger, homelessness, poverty, the lack of quality medical care for many, the lack of quality and equitable education for all children, the lack of equal opportunity and fair wages for so many, indifference to the daily loneliness and isolation many of our sisters and brothers cope with, our addiction to guns and violence, inadequate or non-existent responses to those who suffer debilitating mental illness, the walls between us, and our disconnectedness from God and one another. Tragically, this list goes on and on. God is disturbed by our complacency and our blindness. I believe God wants our love to be reflected in our disturb-edness for the things that disturb God, and our action.



I wonder what disturbs God about me. Could it be my stubborn failure to reconcile with a loved one, my failure to love more fully and intentionally, my need for control, my focus on material things, my indifference to others' needs at times, my judgmentalism and criticalness, my poor stewardship of creation's gifts, my self-serving tendencies, and my inaction when I see need? *My list goes on and on!* I believe God wants me to be disturbed not only by what's happening in the world, but what I, myself, am doing or not doing.

So during this Lenten journey, God, I ask you to disturb us and convict us deeply about the changes you want us to make, in ourselves and in the world. And I ask that you give us the courage, strength and vision to be your messengers of love, even in the face of adversity.

An Action Alert from the ELCA on an important bill for supporting children, homelessness, and food insecurity has been issued for your consideration. We have been asked to contact our US legislators, in particular Senators Kelly and Sinema, to support the passage of a bipartisan tax passage that will give relief to many families. The bill provides an expansion of the Child Tax Credit as well as incentives for low-income housing, and tax breaks for businesses. Family homelessness rose over 17% this year. This bill would help develop over 200,000 new affordable housing units and lift over 400,000 children out of poverty across the US.
