Dear Partners on the Trail

This year I introduced the Easter Vigil on Saturday, Easter Eve. The vigil is an ancient service in the history of the church. Traditionally it is held late at night, beginning in darkness, in a place that is not the sanctuary. After opening prayers, a fire is lighted to dispel the darkness Good Friday had put upon the world. The fire is then carried to the sanctuary as a processional to bring light into the darkened place. From the fire the Christ Candle is lit, and it holds central place in the chancel.

The Vigil, traditionally, was the ending of the preparation for the candidates for Baptism. During the 40 days of Lent, candidates were taught the catechesis, the teachings of Scripture and doctrine. On Easter morning, just after midnight, those candidates would be baptized by immersion, symbolizing dying and rising to new life in Jesus Christ.

Prior to the baptism, Old Testament stories were read. This we did here on Saturday evening - twelve stories read by twelve different readers. The stories came alive as they were read. People commented after the service how meaningful it had been for them to hear the "whole story" not having to use their recall from Sunday School days.

I thought as I listened to all those voices proclaiming the Word of God that that is the role of the Church. Each story pointed out our human frailties. Each reading pointed toward God's rule and reign. And while these were the stories we learned in our Sunday School years, as adults intentionally reading each story in its context, gave such a broad experience of the grace of God.

I began to imagine an adult study group focused upon those stories "we think we know" but hear differently as adults. I would love to lead a group, or a couple of groups, in recalling the epic tales of the Bible, especially the Old Testament.

So, as we prepare for our summer siestas, I want to plant this seed. Pray to God about your need to re-connect with the Living Word of God. Consider your attending a weekly, 90-minute walk through stories you have known all you life.

As we await the monsoons, still 2 or 3 months off....how dry is your faith? How parched is your tongue when you try to pray aloud? How hoarse is your voice when you have the opportunity to introduce someone to Jesus? Consider coming to the living waters found in John 4. I invite each of you to renew and revitalize your living faith at New Spirit.

Come! All of you are welcome on this adventure of faith!

Holy Week Reflections

"This was the best holy week I have ever experienced!" This year our Holy Week services were rewritten in an effort to make the drama of Jesus' Passion. Good Friday we offered the "Seven Last Words of Christ". In brief scenes, and reflections on each scene, the trauma of the crucifixion was lifted up. Hymns added to the imagery of the worst day in human history. The darkened sanctuary, the laid out black drape, the seven candles spread over the altar made Good Friday a deeply spiritual, and moving service.

The **Easter Vigil** was a celebration! Twelve readers led us through the epic stories of the Old Testament. Each one reflected on the imperfection of humanity, and the holiness of God. In the end, we were brought to consider our own Baptism. The service ended with the Affirmation of Baptism of the corporate Body of Christ gathered. "It was a moving experience and really connected me to Easter in a whole new way."

The entire service lifted up the ancient art of oral-interpretation, or story-telling. Apart from the darkness of Good Friday, the **Easter Vigil** enabled participants to anticipate the coming celebration of Jesus' resurrection.

Easter worship was "so full of grace, I could not help but cry." The Praise Team introduced a new song "Raise a Hallelujah". Its chorus was timely following the Notre Dame fire earlier in the week.

"I'm gonna sing in the middle of the storm, louder and louder, hear my praises roar. Up from the ashes hope will arise! Death is defeated, the King is alive!"

With the preface of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil on Saturday made stepping into Easter's Celebration so much more meaningful!

Summer camp is one of the best ways for campers to experience living in a Christ-centered community. Through activities, Bible Studies, games, campfire, worship, and camp meals campers will discover the power of the Spirit's knitting them as a community of faith all within those five days. Registration is \$275 per camper. One half of that registration is paid by New Spirit from our aluminum can

recycling program. The Endowment Board will be asked for additional support as well. Registration is to be done on-line at www.mysalca.com. This year Jakob Rettig will be a Leader in Training (LIT). Camp is for students who have completed 3rd – 8th grade by the beginning of camp.

May Workday is scheduled for Saturday, May 18th at 6:30 a.m. We continue to stand against the weeds brought by our winter rains. We are also cutting trees back to give our "front yard" a less overgrown look. Join us on May18th, and we will share a hearty breakfast at 8:30 a.m.

When you consider that the average cost of getting a return done by a paid preparer is around \$250 that's a big savings for many of our tax payers, especially when many of them found out they were getting a smaller refund (or no refund at all) due to the new tax laws. Thank you church members and volunteers that support this ministry, and have done so for the past 13 years.

The Columbarium is where the cremated remains of New Spirit members are laid to rest. The garden is a beautiful, quiet place for you

We wanted a place that was safe to be who we are, yet open and free to explore and grow.

Open Space is a church, and we worship and pray and grow in our faith together. Every first Thursday night we gather in fellowship to share highs and lows, listen to each other's joys and concerns, and pray for each other, and spend some time in the Bible learning about God and what it might mean for us to live and follow Jesus.

Half of all we do at Open Space is giving art to the community, for free.

A lot of the art we do is graffiti or street art based, but not exclusively. We believe that giving back is a fundamental part of being a Christian, and being artistic is not something for the special people, but something we all can do – being made in the image of God, our creator. Not everyone at Open Space does graffiti, or does a lot of drawing, but we support those who do, and we encourage healthy (and legal) ways to express yourself and explore faith and life through art.

Open Space is a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), an open and progressive denomination that takes the Bible seriously, but not literally – that teaches peace and justice.


