Shortly before Easter, Gate Outreach Ministries here in Tucson lost the use of what had been their worship space. Pastor Fred, who knows Pastor Will Nieves from other connections, saw the news on Facebook and invited them to come join us at New Spirit. Which they did.

About 20 folks from Gate joining New Spirit has increased the volume of our singing, the frequency of shouted "Amens," the number of smiles and hugs, and the spirit of anticipation and joy when we gather to worship our Lord.

We already knew that our former first-service and our former second-service people prefer different styles of worship, and especially of music. So not everyone grooves to all the music in our blended worship every Sunday. But that goes to another level when a young woman who's used to moving to the (Christian contemporary) music at Gate throws her hands in the air to try to dance to the 17th-century melody (written for organ) of the hymn "Now All the Vault of Heaven Resounds." That was a challenge, but it didn't dim her enthusiasm. There was danceable music coming up.

Thinking about that makes me smile. And, in fact, I've been seeing lots of smiles from Gate folks and New Spirit folks these past weeks. Our faces are becoming familiar to one another as we mutually welcome each other as sisters and brothers in Christ and enjoy each other's company.

That's a beautiful thing. For all our different backgrounds, different ages, different tastes in music, etc., we all recognized each other from the first moment as sisters and brothers. We know and feel that we belong together in one family, long-lost brothers, instantly loved sisters.

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity," the psalmist wrote (Ps. 133:1). How true that is!

Gate is currently looking for a new space to call their own, so we don't know how much longer we'll be seeing each other every week. But, however long we have this connection in time and space, we've always had an eternal connection—even if we didn't know it would be so fun!

MOVING FORWARD WITH GEARHART PROJECTS

At a congregational meeting on Sunday, April 24, we voted by a decisive margin to go ahead with improvements to our building and grounds using funds from the generous bequest New Spirit received from the estate of Virginia Gearhart.

For two months last year, we solicited ideas for spending some of the Gearhart funds in ways that would further our strategic objectives of growing in numbers and in depth of discipleship and set us up for the next chapter in the life of our congregation.

All the projects proposed for the "Strategic Wish List" will be funded following the congregational vote. Over time, as we are able to finalize plans and have work done, you'll see: a new, electronic sign to invite and welcome people to New Spirit; updated, comfortable furnishings in the library; new flooring for the library, hallway, and offices; a higher wall to enhance the patio; and sails to provide shade to the patio and lengthen the time (time of year and time of day) when it's usable.

May God bless this willingness to invest financial resources in a future that is, after all, in God's hands.

PASTORAL TRANSITION TEAM UPDATE

After gathering a lot of input from the congregation through in-person meetings, forums, and surveys, the Transition Team met to decide how to transfer all that information into a document called a Ministry Site Profile (MSP). After a final review and approval by the Church Council, our MSP went to the Grand Canyon Synod Bishop for approval, which it received quickly. Our MSP is now posted online, where prospective pastoral candidates can read it. With that, the Transition Team has finished its task.

Do you ever feel like your life is out of control—too much to get done, too many people to please, things you want to do that you don't get to, things that sap your joy but seem unavoidable?





The two main focus areas for the Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in AZ this year are hunger issues and civic engagement. By reading the LAMAz.org website on Tuesdays, we can become aware of various ways that we can be educated about those two issues as well as how to become involved.



Hunger issues are always concerns that are addressed every week on the website. Monthly ZOOM meetings, to which we are all welcomed to participate in, are presented online. Writing letters to our Congressional leaders, both national and state, encouraging them to support bills that would provide money for feeding our vulnerable populations is a viable option.

The AZ legislative body has bills regarding changes in voting laws that also may interest you. This website explains what the bills are about and the positions of the ELCA on these bills. You may contact your congressional representatives to inform them of your stance on any or all of these bills. You may also participate in the Right to Speak forum by commenting on line after going through the registration process with help from Solveig Muus, our director of LAMAZ.
