Saints of New Spirit,

As we enter May, there are some exciting things on the horizon. I would like to offer an observation before talking about some of the exciting things we have coming up. That observation is that for some, things are not moving quick enough related to changes, growth, and new, while for others, we are already going at a pace that feels too quick. Change is hard for all of us; some of us are just equipped to handle change quicker. Others of us need more time to process and accept change. The leadership of New Spirit, including myself, try to maintain a balanced approach. Personally, I want you to know that I happened to fall into the same camp of Admiral David Glasgow Farragut. When his ship came up against mines (at the time referred to as torpedoes) in the water during the battle of Mobile Bay in August 1864 he gave the command "Damn the torpedoes, Full speed ahead!" I have that mindset especially after a decision has been made. It is an urge that I am constantly trying to rein in, while also following that tendency when appropriate. I pray every day that we all can accept a balanced approach while it may still make us uncomfortable because it is either too fast or too slow. I believe that we can do something very special here at New Spirit. We have a strong foundation to build upon, if all of us take on certain tasks, and with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we can truly change the world through spreading the love and gospel of Jesus.

We have some exciting updates and plans coming through the remainder of the year. On May 7, our Church Council will provide some updates to projects including the sign, as well as the goals they established at the council retreat. Some of these goals are aggressive and will certainly require all our efforts to achieve. Some of these plans will be different than what we have done before, and others may be similar, but all have deep thought and prayer behind them. There will be a renewed focus on prayer starting May 28, that you will hear more about in the coming weeks. We will step out of our church and begin attending more community events. We will be increasing the number of events held at our church but outside of the sanctuary. We will continue to embrace technology to enhance our ministries. We will be focusing on building relationships and community here that goes beyond Sunday morning.

In the gospel of John, we hear a lot about abiding in Jesus. John 15:5 has Jesus stating that he is the vine, and we are the branches. If we abide in Jesus, we will bear much fruit. To abide in Jesus means that there should not be the ability to see where Jesus ends and where we begin. We continue Jesus' ministry in this time and place. As a congregation, we are starting to see some fruit and I believe we will see more if we continue to abide in Jesus. There is a reason we have been called together by the Holy Spirit to do ministry in this place and at this time. I am excited about our future. I pray that you have that same excitement and commitment to follow where we are being led.

In closing I ask you to pray this prayer throughout the month of May.

"Jesus, we know that you are with us. We ask that you continue to guide New Spirit Lutheran Church. We ask you to continue to send the Holy Spirit so that we may know where we are being called. Help us to continue to abide in you in all that we do. Amen"

Expecting God

Something's in the air at New Spirit! I can feel it in my gut and my heart. Now, maybe it's just me. Maybe it's because we're still in Easter season and I haven't quite come down from the excitement of Jesus' resurrection. Maybe it's because it's Spring in the desert, or maybe it's because I'm excited about the great ideas we tossed around at the Council retreat. But I can definitely feel the Spirit moving at New Spirit.

I recently read an article in the ELCA newsletter by Rev. Dr. Robin Steinke, professor and president of Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. She titled it, "The Risen Christ is Present in the Toughest Places." She described the fear that the two Marys experienced when they first encountered the angel and then Jesus at the empty tomb. The first words from the angel and Jesus were "do not be afraid." The Marys experienced great joy simultaneously with fear (perhaps wonder and uncertainty?) as they are sent to "go and tell."

Rev. Steinke goes on to talk about a layover she had in Trinidad while traveling to attend a Lutheran World Federation meeting. She wandered around the center of the city and encountered a church called the Church of Miracles. The sign said, "worship every day at 7pm, miracles Sunday morning at 9:30." And, of course, she wondered whether these faithful people really expected miracles to happen at exactly 9:30 on Sunday mornings! "Then I realized this congregation expected God to show up and expected something to happen on Sunday morning. I suspect there may have been a mixture of fear and joy on Sunday mornings."

So where am I going with all of this, you might ask. I was so struck by the statement that these people *expected God to show up* and for *something to happen*. I wonder if we sometimes just go through the motions of praying without really expecting anything to happen! Do I really expect God to show up and *for something to happen* on Sunday mornings, or any time, for that matter?

We have certainly experienced some "tough times" at New Spirit in the way of declining membership and financial giving, and the disruption caused by COVID. Many of us have experienced feelings of uncertainty and worry, if not fear, about whether New Spirit could turn it around. But do we believe,

truly believe, that the risen Christ is present in all of these worries and uncertainties? I believe that He is! Christ is showing up in our efforts to grow (that's already happening), our spiritual development AND our becoming financially whole again! So, I'm experiencing lots of joy alongside a bit of continued anxiety and uncertainty. I expect Christ to show up and work through His Body at New Spirit – in our outreach efforts, our worship and study, our efforts to grow young, and yes, even in our giving. We are blessed to be a blessing through our church embracing the world. Today, may Christ "show up" through our generous hearts in our finances and in service, as we live out God's plan for New Spirit with joy and confidence.



PASTOR'S BOOK STUDY (April book review by Brigitte Stuetze):

Our book study just completed reading and discussing BAPTIZED IN TEAR GAS FROM WHITE MODERATE TO ABOLITIONIST by Pastor Elle Dowd.

This book is very much a needed addition to the anti-racism conversation. She is the real deal—passionate, thoughtful and gritty.

Having grown up post war in Germany, we loved the black soldiers and followed them in our streets. Their rarity made them special to us. Imagine my shock, once in the States, when I saw the opposite.

Pastor Dowd educates US about white supremacy, racial capitalism and anti-Black racism. She helped me imagine my own journey from white moderate to abolitionist. She shows us how to be willing to confront our own complicity and challenges the lies of American racism.

All this she does through her own experiences during the Ferguson Uprising in Missouri in 2014. She holds up a mirror to us white people and shows us how anti-Blackness shows up in our thoughts, faith and behavior.

It was a most thought provoking book to me and our study group. We hope to be able to take steps toward undoing some of our very white behaviors as individuals as well as NSLC. We owe it to ourselves and each other to be truly welcoming to ALL.
