

Dear Partners in the Gospel,

It is November already, which means the end of the "Church year" is right around the corner. For the past 12 months we have been reading the Gospel according to Luke on Sundays. His Gospel is rich in detailed stories and parables. His theology points us toward the breadth of welcome, and the breadth of grace God has of all people. Luke is unique in that. Outsiders, women and children find a key role in Luke's telling of Jesus' ministry. The parables of the Lost Sheep, Lost Coin, and Prodigal Son are stories in grace's inclusiveness.

I hope you have found your faith deepening through the Gospel readings from the past year.

November begins with our remembrance of those who have died, and now experience God's gifts of mercy and grace in the feast that has no end. We have had a number of deaths this past year. These people both blest and supported the ministry of New Spirit for decades. Their absence now leaves a vacuum in some areas of our congregational life. Yet, in remembering them, we are doubly blessed. Look for their names in this newsletter.

November brings the presentation of New Spirit's **2020 Operating Budget: Mission Plan.** We are hopeful to fund a much pared down budget. We are committed to supporting the greater Church through the Grand Canyon Synod, and the ELCA nationwide. The Gospel is vital for the world to come to that peace that comes through Jesus. Next month, we will be in the season of Advent, and we will hear God's promise through Isaiah that the One to come will be known as "the Prince of Peace." Have you ever thought that your weekly tithes to the ministry of New Spirit would foster a world at peace? It could, and will, if we are able to put that much trust in God's providing.

Of course, God's providing is the base of our Thanksgiving celebrations. That holiday feast is intended to connect our hearts and stomachs with the faithfulness of God toward us. Feasts will be held around the nation giving thanks for the abundance that we enjoy.

Imagine not being able to eat that feast. Imagine being held in custody while others decided whether your life, or the life of your children, is "worthy" of freedom. While most of us will gather with family, friends and a host of remembrances and plenty of food, here in Tucson and in Eloy close by hundreds of children are being held in custody apart from mom and dad. In Eloy, hundreds of moms and dads are being held as they escaped from the terror of gangs, soldiers and death squads in El Salvador and Nicaragua. There may well be thoughts and prayers of thanksgiving among those seeking refuge. But, wouldn't being

thoughts and prayers of thanksgiving among those seeking refuge. But, wouldn't being together with mom, dad and the kids be as joyful for them, as it will be for you as you sit down to feast on Thanksgiving? I believe your joy and their joy are the same.

Luke has guided our faith journey this year on Sundays. Jesus has taught us what it means to be a neighbor. What it means to be lost and then found. What it means to be persistent in pleading with God through prayer, action and intent.

It is November already. I encourage you to take a moment each day to reflect, before you get dragged into the scurry of the Holiday Season I call "Thanksmas!". Try to be mindful each day of God's providing and God's call to justice and peace.

Town Hall Meeting to consider the Refugee Crisis

On October 6th 40+ people, not all members of New Spirit, gathered in the Fellowship Hall to talk about the ELCA's decision to become a "Sanctuary Church." Pastor Alan was unable to lead the discussion. The discussion was not to have been a partisan-political debate. It was intended to begin the conversation about being a welcoming community; understanding how the Theology of the Cross (Martin Luther) calls us to acts of justice for the least, the last, the little, and the lone. The discussion was to have had participants consider their Baptismal role in being the church of Jesus Christ. The discussion was to be the first of a series of gatherings to listen, to learn, and to understand the actions that we can make while not breaking any laws.

The Lutheran perspective of faithfulness is that we are called to "accompany those whose life and faith are in peril." Accompaniment does not drop a refugee at a distant bus stop and expect the penny-less, shoelace-less, non-English-speaking person to make their way to a court hearing in 8 days, 30 miles away. (Imagine if that was your plight in Laos, or Chile, or Rwanda, or Korea.) Hard to imagine? It is genuine for thousands of people, each a child of God as are we.

Christians have offered safety to people in need for 2,000 years. Three years ago the ELCA committed itself to a strategy called AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation, and Opportunities) working with our faith partners in Central America to alleviate the conditions that cause people to migrate. In the U.S. the ELCA has a network of 151 welcoming and sanctuary congregations that are committed to working on migration issues while offering protection and advocacy for children. The ELCA has five Sanctuary Synods, all of which do work with immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers.

Just four years ago, the annual allotment for refugees into America was 1.4 million. Those persons went through the process of 22 security interviews, arranged sponsorship, and were given assistance to begin their journey to citizenship. Today, November 1st, that number has been reduced from 1,400,000 to 16,000 with threats to reduce legal immigration to 0 (zero).

Protection for the most vulnerable is why immigration work is important.

Would "safety" be a high priority for you travelling with your children? Of course it would. Can't that same desire be held by frightened moms, terrified children, and hope-filled dads? Safety is a Christian ethic. Hospitality is a Christian ethic. Feeding the hungry is a Christian ethic.

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held, Sunday, December 8th at 4:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.



The **Agenda** will include the election of Church Council members, the election of one Endowment Board member, the appointment of Audit Committee members and one Memorial Garden Columbarium Board member.
