Beloved of New Spirit,

It is hard to believe we only have 2 months left for this year. When I look back at the past year, I am amazed by the work that God has called us to do at this time and in this place. In January we voted on and adopted a new welcome statement. The months following have been spent asking questions and dreaming about how we can live into our welcome statement more fully.

Welcome, beloved of God!

Welcome people from every tradition and those new to the faith. This is a place where you are welcome to celebrate and sorrow, to rejoice and to recover.

This is a place where lives are made new.

Welcome to all who want to follow Christ, have no church home, have doubts, have questions, or do not believe.

Welcome to new visitors and old friends.

Welcome to all who have ever felt hurt or unwelcome by the church. Welcome to people of every age, color and culture, marital status, ability and challenge, sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression and all things that make us unique individuals created by God.

expression and all things that make us unique individuals created by God. Welcome to a community where love, mercy, grace, and forgiveness are valued and practiced.

Welcome to a community that stands against the evils of this world including all forms of racism, hatred, and bigotry.

No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here.

Come, follow Christ with us. Welcome, again, on this day. Welcome to New Spirit.

Some of the ways we have lived into that statement have been small, for example using more contrasting texts and backgrounds for the slides used during worship. We have also gone back to including the majority of the texts for items like the Prayers of Intercession for those that struggle with hearing. There have also been big ways we have lived into our welcome statement, like the installation of the power doors on both sides of the sanctuary.

For some these improvements may not mean much, for those that are directly impacted by them they are the physical embodiment of the welcome we claim to practice here. Of course, there is always more that we can do. We know that we need to have our hearing loop system looked at and possibly replaced in a way that will ensure the system meets the needs of those that use it.

We are also working to better extend welcome to those that are in the LGBTQIA2S+ community. Things like placing rainbow streamers in the narthex, wearing lanyards with the rainbow flag, and more are visible signs of welcome to a community that often is excluded by churches. Personally, your efforts to love and support my oldest go beyond any words I can write. You all have made the effort to call my oldest Tobias even though that is not the name he had when he was first introduced to you. You have also made the change to using the pronouns he/him instead of ones that were initially used for Tobias. During the beginning of 2025 we will explore the option of officially becoming a Reconciling in Christ congregation.

There may be some that wonder if these changes were necessary. There may be some that disagree or don't understand. <u>Advent</u>

This year we will be using resources from Sanctified Art, the same company we used for this year's Lenten resources. These resources include words for worship services, home devotional, and faith enrichment activities. The first Sunday of Advent is December 1st.



"Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown.

This worship series is shaped around several reminders we all need from time to time: you are a blessing; we can't go alone; do the good that is yours to do; hope is worth the risk; love knows your name; don't forget to laugh; and the road isn't straight. These reminders root us in the fundamental truths of our faith. Many of them are life lessons we teach to children—lessons that adults continue to learn and relearn. They may resemble the blessings we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies like weddings, graduations, or baptisms. And so, we invite you to move through this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead. For no matter what you are facing, no matter what this new day brings, love is your beginning."

Church Council Update:

After a bit of a break for the summer, the council is again meeting monthly in their leadership role here at New Spirit. Agenda items in the near future include reviewing current security levels both inside and outside of our buildings and property; preparing for our annual congregation meeting, including a proposed budget and slate of officers for 2025; and ways to expand how we "live into" our Welcome Statement. As Pastor Hartman mentioned in the September Newsletter: this includes identifying New Spirit's key values and guiding principles in such a way to "help us focus our efforts on specific community needs and ministries." It is how we will bring our Welcome Statement to life and "embrace who we are as a community in new and exciting ways."

Recent actions by the council include the hiring of Aaron, our new custodian - please introduce yourself to him as your paths cross and welcome him here. The council also approved the upgrade of the lighting system in the Sanctuary, as well as automating the doors into the Narthex. The council continues to look for new opportunities to expand our outreach into the community, and recently contracted with the Park Place to share publicly "who we are and what we're



doing" within the community.

We ask that you continue to pray for the church council in their leadership role here at New Spirit.

Women's Ministry

Called to Love, "For Such a Time as This"

"For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?" (Esther 4:14)

The Book of Esther teaches us that God is sovereign over human plans and operates behind the scenes without our knowing it. That's what God did with Esther. God put Esther in the right place at the right time ("at such a time as this") to save the Jews. Likewise, God uses each and every one of us and New Spirit as the body of Christ, to serve divine purposes.

That's the theme of our 2025 Stewardship Appeal, with special attention to improving accessibility for all our siblings and living more fully into our welcome statement. Our goal is to increase our income by \$40,000. To that end, our initiatives are:

Creating Safe and Welcome Spaces – (\$8,000 or \$154/week)

Enlarge and update the bathroom in the nursery room to accommodate those who use wheelchairs or walkers and require the assistance of a caretaker; convert the nursery into a comfortable, private space for families to grieve and/or receive pastoral care; purchase therapeutic items for the cry room, to calm and soothe someone who is experiencing sensory overload and needs a quiet space to worship.

Increasing Sensitivity for Those Facing Special Challenges – (\$2,000 or \$39/week) Provide two half-day workshops and educational resources to increase our understanding, sensitivity, and inclusive advocacy for our siblings in Christ who live with special circumstances.

Sustaining and Growing in Ministry Excellence – (\$30,000, or \$577/week) Close the gap between our income and day-to-day expenses (see the Building Towards Sustainability article).

You will learn more about these important ministry initiatives in the next couple of weeks. You will also receive a letter and a statement of intent or commitment. If you have not submitted a commitment in the past, we thank you for the generous gifts you have given over the years, and we encourage you to consider making a formal commitment this year. We are seeking 100% return on statements of intent. If you have regularly committed over the years, we thank you for your intentional faithfulness and encourage you to increase your giving as you are able.

Stewardship Sunday will be November 17, 2025. At that time, we will bring our statements of intent to the altar. In the following weeks, we will celebrate your generosity and faithfulness.

Building Towards Sustainability

You may recall that last year when we began an intentional stewardship approach, we set as our main initiative to increase overall giving by \$120,000 over a four-year period of time. In 2024 our initiative to address this four-year plan, which we called Sustaining and Growing in Ministry Excellence, was to increase giving by \$30,000. By the end of 2024 we will have achieved that goal by 88%. Way to go, New Spirit! Thank you for your generosity and faithfulness!

New Spirit is so blessed! We are mortgage-free, and we have the blessings of a healthy endowment fund and restricted funds from the bequests of faithful members over the years. Restricted funds have afforded New Spirit the ability to address issues like fixing the sanctuary lighting and installing long-needed automatic door openers to the sanctuary. Restricted funds are also critical for those "rainy day" emergencies that occasionally befall our aging buildings and campus. These are appropriate uses of restricted funds. Endowment dividends are used twice a year to bless community agencies and ministries through grant awards. Endowment principle funds are generally reserved for special ministry drives like our Growing Seasons initiative. Through Growing Seasons, two-year "seed money" for a much-needed Worship Leader and funds to freshen up our campus, among other things were provided.

The tough reality is that for many years, New Spirit's giving has not kept up with week-to-week operational expenses, even though our budget projections have been modest. Years ago we dealt with the deficits we were facing by not enacting or fully realizing our visions and dreams for New Spirit. A couple of years ago our projected budget deficit was so great, the congregation approved the use of all of the funds in the smaller Arivaca Endowment Fund and \$100,000 of the principle of the primary Endowment Fund towards our operation budget. These monies sustained us for two years.

We do not want to keep drawing from restricted and endowment funds indefinitely to meet our operational budget. And we don't want to sacrifice our ministry and outreach goals and visions and become stagnant. In other words, it is critical that New Spirit continues to *sustain and grow in ministry excellence*! To get there, we must continue to close the gap between our giving and our day-to-day expenses. In this second of our four year goal of doing that, we need to increase giving by another \$30,000, or \$577/week.

Faithful New Spirit siblings, each and every one of you are vital to New Spirit's mission! We hope that you will prayerfully consider your response to the call of stewardship, respond with generous hearts, and increase your giving as you are able.
