Dear Partners on the Trail....

"We need to talk." I'm not sure if those four words strike fear in your soul, but when I hear them I know that what's coming next is important. "We need to talk."

Church ministry takes people who serve. For a number of years, New Spirit has grown pretty complacent about how we operate. "Things work well on Sundays" so everything must be going well. Yes, that's true....but....and there's always a but.

If you have not served as a teacher, team member, office worker, reader/communion assistant, or singer/instrumentalist in the past two years it is your time to step up. Our teams have work to be done. Our image in the community needs some attention. Our connections with each other need to be attended to.

Many of us have become strangers to others. It happens. In a culture where busy-ness is honored, and time is not a renewable resource, we have become disconnected. I think of the rings of Saturn which from a distance are beautiful, and amazing. But, a closer look reveals chunks of ice and stone in a parallel orbit, rarely connecting, rarely touching, but always just sort of.....there. Church can feel like that.

We need to talk. There are important conversations that need to be had. On October 6th, we will be holding a <u>Town Hall Meeting</u> at 3:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. We are going to talk about our life together in 2019, and about the ELCA Churchwide Assembly vote to designate the ELCA as a "Sanctuary Church." It is a first in this country. It is deeply historical in our context. The Lutheran Church has provided broad sponsorship of refugees and immigrants for well over 100 years in America. How might New Spirit participate, legally, in offering welcome and acceptance. We need to talk.

We need to talk about worship, and education, and connection groups to better facilitate our life as the Body of Christ at Camino Seco and Old Spanish Trail.

We need to talk, and we will be doing more intentional talks over the coming months. This is the season of the shared word, the identified dreams, and the approachable goals. But, none of us are mind-readers, so we will need to take some time, to sit and talk, sit and listen. We have to talk.

Those four words can mean the world to this faith community.

We need to talk! We do.

Youth and ELCA National Youth Gathering – Minneapolis

Our Youth population ebbs and flows over the years. Today, our Middle School and High School youth number an even dozen. Twelve is the perfect size for a vibrant youth group. Twelve is the best size for service projects, playing games, and conversing about difficult subjects. I think Jesus thought 12 was an important number, as he called together his first group of students.

In 19 months, 40,000 youth and adults from across the country will be heading to Minneapolis for the ELCA National Youth Gathering. New Spirit's youth have been working to raise funds for that event. We hold two fund raisers each year: the dinner after the Annual Meeting (2nd Sunday in December), and the Easter Breakfast. The youth do most of the prep and serving for those projects.

Now for the hard stuff. Just because a youth is a "member" of New Spirit does not mean they get an "automatic pass" to attend the Gathering. Worship is central to our life of faith, and regular worship attendance is expected. The Gathering is a week-long event centered in worship…so if worship is not important to parents or youth, they wouldn't like a Gathering.

Strangers don't travel well. We will be living in hotel rooms for a week. Unless youth have established relationships with one another that time can be difficult. We are planning a number of Youth Group activities between now and then to help knit this group together. It will be in those experiences youth will make connections.

"Super Group" still has occasional meetings here in Tucson, and we will plan on attending those events when they happen.

The total cost for a youth to attend a National youth Gathering is close to \$1,000. Parents are responsible to pay the Gathering registration fee: \$350. That payment will be due next September!!! The other \$650/per youth is raised by the youth. That covers airfare, hotel rooms, and a food stipend. Adult leaders attend at no cost, but the youth fundraising covers their costs. Adults do need to take a week vacation from work.

More information will be forthcoming.



Adult Ed "The Epic Stories of the Bible" have been intriguing on Wednesdays at 4:00 p.m. Long-term we are looking at opportunities to engage more members in faithful learning. Growth in faith is a life-long journey. In what ways are you a life-long student?

Feed My Starving Children will be hosting a Million Meal Packing Weekend, February 7, 8, 9, 2020. We have been invited to pack at Resurrection Lutheran Church the morning of Saturday, February 8th. Feed My Starving Children packs nutritionally engineered meals for children in third world countries (112 countries at present.) These packing sessions are great fun, and participants enjoy the music, the competition, and the camaraderie.



New Spirit needs to bring 40-50 packers for the two-hour packing session. More info, and a sign-up sheet will be appearing soon!!!

Town Hall Meeting ELCA "Sanctuary Church"

At the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in August, the delegation voted overwhelmingly to declare the ELCA a "Sanctuary Denomination." What does that mean for New Spirit? The fact that 90% of the voting members affirmed that resolution is significant.

But.....the ELCA does not dictate to congregations things "we must do." Every congregation has the opportunity to choose among themselves about how we will do our ministry.

Our Synod is a border Synod. Immigration, refugees, and asylum seekers are political matters that is in our own front yards.

We will have a New Spirit – Town Hall Meeting on Sunday, October 6th, at 3:00 p.m. in



Fellowship Hall. This will be an informal time for conversation about what role New Spirit will take. Since this will not be a "congregational meeting" no vote will be binding. Information from that conversation will be presented to the Church Council. A resolution may come from that, and would be voted on at the Annual Meeting on December 8th.

Confirmation Update - The class has completed its study of the Lord's Prayer, and will begin their study of the Apostle's Creed and begin a lengthy study about "Who is Jesus?" The class is now in the early process of writing their "Statements of Faith."

Last week I read a brief story that touched me deeply. It was about a man observing a huge crew of people building a cathedral. It was massive and the most impressive structure that the townspeople had ever seen. The visitor stopped to observe an old man carefully carving a delicate, detailed little bird at the end of one of the rafters. The visitor asked the man, "Why would you spend your time carving this beautiful bird if no one can see it?" As the man lovingly continued his artistic work, he smiled and said, "Yes, but God can."
