God's Stewards at New Spirit,

Where did 2023 go? We have three months until 2024! When I reflect on the last nine months, I am simply amazed. I am amazed by the generosity that we have here at New Spirit. We are a generous congregation in so many ways. I have witnessed generosity in both big ways and in small ways. During the peanut butter drive, enough peanut butter was collected to provide for all those that come through ICS's mobile food pantry here at NSLC on Thursdays for a whole month. When the schools we serve through BIB said they needed shoes to keep on hand for the kids, we set a goal of 25 pairs of shoes. As of this morning, 75 pairs plus socks have been placed into our collection bin. Even with Trunk or Treat being about a month away, as I write this article, we are already well on our way of surpassing the number of goodies we gave away last year. All these examples, and so many more, are examples of the spirit of generosity that is here.

Generosity and stewardship go hand in hand. I would dare say that the two abide in each other, meaning that they are so closely related that it is hard to tell where one ends and the other begins. During the month of October through mid-November, we will be spending intentional time discussing stewardship. During the first week of October, devotions that are focused on stewardship will be available to use at home. Starting October 8<sup>th</sup>, Sunday morning Adult Faith Formation will begin a Bible study on stewardship. There will be temple talks and sermons focused on stewardship. I am excited to see how our new approach to stewardship will increase the generosity that is already abundant here at NSLC. I encourage everyone to take an active role in participating in this effort.

In addition to the intentional focus on stewardship, we will also have events like our first game afternoon, an open mic/coffee house, Reformation Sunday, and our annual Trunk or Treat event. We will tackle the most difficult book in Pastor's Book Study for this year, "Dear Church". All of this while we continue our efforts to invite people to experience the welcome and community found here.

We are continuing to see growth in our Sunday attendance and involvement in various ministries. So far out of 38 Sundays, only 10 have seen lower attendance than 2022. If things continue to go the way they have been, I think we will see at least a 5% growth in our average Sunday attendance!! With so many congregations continuing to see a decrease in attendance or fighting to maintain, to show any growth is fantastic! Looking at the average Sunday attendance numbers for NSLC dating back to 2008, the overall trend was downward. There were some years that showed a slight increase from the previous. Those slight increases were all less than 5%. You all have been key in this effort, from inviting friends to helping promote events hosted at NSLC to volunteering at community festivals. It has been your efforts that are leading to this growth. It will be your efforts that sustain this growth in the coming years. I try not to focus too much on the future regarding numbers, and yet I again find myself very hopeful. I am optimistic that when I am writing October 2024's newsletter article we will continue to see growth. It is possible that our average Sunday attendance will be above 100.

All of this has only been possible because of your efforts paired with the work of the Holy Spirit. We are seeing these amazing things happen because we have opened ourselves to the movement of the Holy Spirit and where God is calling us as community. We are being called to spread the love, grace, mercy, and peace that God has for humanity. We are doing that by living into the calling we see Jesus giving his followers in scripture. We are living into the words of Matthew 25:31-46 and doing so out of the abundance that God has entrusted to us. Let us continue to act out of abundance when it comes to all aspects of our lives together as community.

Our annual Trunk or Treat community outreach event also shows how we share God's gifts to us every year. Our Noisy Offering Sundays, Prayground, plastic recycling, and ..... (just think about some of your favorite ministries you support). These ministries are supported financially, prayerfully, and in actions of generosity of our time and abilities – all gifts from God. As stewards of these gifts, Steve Garnaas-Holmes explains our role in this way –

A good steward understands money, not for the money, but for the possibilities.

Yes, thanks to our financial support of these ministries we can continue to show that we are a church family that shares, cares, gives, loves and continues to grow. And, as stewards of God's gifts he has blessed us with, let's continue to look and support other possibilities for us to show God's love to others.
