A YEAR LOST TO LOCUSTS?

There's a verse from the prophet Joel that's stuck in my mind for years. Israel has suffered through a horrible and devastating infestation of locusts followed by drought. The people call out to God for mercy. God responds. God makes his presence known to them and declares that relief is on the way. He promises that the land will be green and bountiful again. Not only does God promise a turnaround in their circumstances, he makes this straightforward promise: God says, through Joel, "I will repay you for the years the locusts have eaten" (Joel 2:25).

It's not just that the future will be better. It's that God is going to ... what? ... tack on years to their lives to make up for the years of suffering? Or make the next few years so spectacular that Israel will feel they came out even? We don't know precisely what God had in mind with these words. But they're a powerful reminder of just who we're dealing with when we're dealing with our God. Or, it's probably better to say, we're reminded just who's dealing with us.

This is the God who created and continues to create the world. This is the author of time. This is God who is limitless in compassion as well as in power. This is our God who holds our years in his loving hands.



Remember these words from John's vision in Revelation, a glimpse of what's to come:

And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away."



And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true." (Revelation 21:3-5)

Friends, these words are trustworthy and true. Our hope at all times is in the trustworthy and true promises of God. Our reliance on God is just more obvious during some times than others. This is one of those times when our hope gets a chance to shine. May your hope and trust in God be strong and shining. May it light up not just your own life but also the lives of everyone around you.

A NEW NORMAL FOR SUNDAYS (FOR NOW)

THE STORY

If you've read the Bible all the way through, congratulations! It's not easy to do. The many story lines, characters, and obscure historical references can be a challenge for any reader. But, yet, it's so helpful to get a grasp of the overall sweep of the story contained in the Bible—the amazing and glorious story of God's history with humankind. From creation in Genesis to John's end-time vision in Revelation, God carries on a real, lively relationship with the world and the people he brings into being, loves, and redeems.



Starting September 20, we—God's people at New Spirit Lutheran Church, along, we hope, with new friends from the community around us—will dive into Scripture as we read together through *The Story*. *The Story* is the Bible abridged and put into chronological order. The text of Scripture is connected by brief, italicized sections to help the reader follow the narrative through transitions. We'll read from Genesis through Revelation in 31 weeks, with a manageable number of pages per week.

In a disconnected season of our life as a community of faith, this is a way we can all be on the same page, grown-ups and children, everyone reading the same stories at the same time.

Throughout the week, we'll offer conversation opportunities for people to get together online or in-person-at-a-distance to talk about what we're learning about God and about ourselves through our reading. We also want to invite people who aren't yet part of New Spirit to join us in reading and conversation.

Watch for information about picking up your copy of *The Story* in September. We'll deliver to anyone who can't swing by church for pick-up.

WOMEN IN MINISTRY, JULY 15, BIBLE STUDY

The meeting was held in the Fellowship Hall at New Spirit: 2 persons to a table with masks. It was uplifting to see and hear our sisters in faith in person .

The study was Part Two of the summer Bible study series "Just Love," based on the story of Zacchaeus, a rich and chief tax-collector, in Luke 19.



We shared memories of the little song "Zacchaeus," with the motions some of us had learned as children in Bible or Sunday School.

Zacchaeus was excited for the chance to see Jesus in person and perhaps hear what he had to say in passing. (Reminded us of our joy at being together.)

The study led us to the part of the story that developed between Jesus and Zacchaeus when they were at Zacchaeus's home. The friendship that developed was life-changing for Zacchaeus. His eyes, mind, and heart were opened to another view of life and of those around him. "Just Love" enters his life as he acknowledges his sin and offers to make amends. The change of generosity was in his heart. Not everyone in the community had the same feelings about this development— "All who saw it began to grumble..." We explored the grumblings, attitudes, and old habits from our experiences and what that looks like in our lives, in our family or neighborhood, and in our church community.

We explored what the ELCA Social Statement "The Church and Criminal Justice" is and how that might encourage in the practice of "Just Love," restorative justice.

From the story of a wee little man long ago to us today, God is reaching out through us for "Just Love" to be for the whole human race.

We were surprised and excited to see Pastors Carol and Fred for a few minutes and introduce the group to them.

To ensure the kids in our community have full bellies over the weekend, Blessings in a Backpack sends them home on Fridays with snack packs full of satisfying and nutritional food. Who will feed the kids this weekend?

We will! This school year, we will be feeding **289** children from Erickson, Ford, Steele, and Henry Elementary Schools, providing snack packs for them to take home on the weekend. Typical items include macaroni 'n' cheese box, canned sausages, chicken or tuna, oatmeal, canned beans or pasta, cereal, hot cocoa, canned vegetable, and fruit cup.

HOMELESS BLESSINGS UPDATE

It's tough on the streets. For some, it's tough to keep a roof over their head. Their stories are heartbreaking. Mental health, alcohol, and drug issues are just part of the problem. These are also people who have just had a perfect storm of health, employment, and financial issues and now find themselves homeless or close to it.

Our event the 2nd Saturday of each month has been limited to a couple volunteers and scaled back items as we all struggle through this COVID-19 pandemic. The turnout has been low, but we make up for that by preparing drawstring bags with basic hygiene items— toothpaste, toothbrush, wipes, lotion, band aids, antiseptic lotion, and pain reliever. In addition to flashlights and batteries, we also include extra food items. These bags can then be carried in your car and passed out to any needy person you see on the street. We are determined to reach as many of this vulnerable population as ever. If you are interested in obtaining a few bags to pass out, please contact us.
